H.B. 2072

A BILL to amend and reenact §20-7-1a and §20-7-1c of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as
amended, all relating to providing an increase in compensation for conservation officers.
Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

1 That §20-7-1a and §20-7-1c of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be 2 amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

ARTICLE 7. LAW ENFORCEMENT, MOTORBOATING, LITTER.

§20-7-1a. Conservation officers salary increase based on length of service.

1 (a) Effective the first day of July, two thousand two, each conservation officer shall receive 2 and be entitled to an increase in salary based on length of service, including that heretofore and 3 hereafter served as a conservation officer as follows: For five years of service with the division, 4 a conservation officer shall receive a salary increase of six hundred dollars per year payable 5 during his or her next three years of service and a like increase at three-year intervals thereafter, 6 with these increases to be cumulative. Each conservation officer whose salary is fixed and 7 specified pursuant to section one-c of this article shall receive, and is entitled to, an increase in 8 salary over that set forth in section one-c of this article, for grade in rank, based on length of 9 service including service before and after the effective date of this section as a conservation officer 10 as follows: At the end of two years of service as a conservation officer, the officer shall receive 11 a salary increase of \$400 to be effective during his or her next year of service and a like increase 12 at yearly intervals thereafter, with the increases to be cumulative. 13 A salary increase shall be based upon years of service as of July 1 of each year and may 14 not be recalculated until July 1 of the following year. 15 Conservation officers in service at the time the amendment to this section becomes

16 effective shall be are given credit for prior service and shall be paid such salaries as the same

	§20-7-1c. Conservation officers, ranks, salary schedule, base pay, exceptions.
1	(a) Notwithstanding any provision of this code to the contrary, the ranks within the
2	law-enforcement section of the Division of Natural Resources are colonel, lieutenant colonel,
3	major, captain, lieutenant, sergeant, corporal, conservation officer first class, senior conservation
4	officer, conservation officer and conservation officer-in-training. Each officer while in uniform
5	shall wear the insignia of rank as provided by the chief conservation officer.
6	(b) Beginning July 1, 2002, and continuing thereafter, conservation officers shall be paid
7	the minimum annual salaries based on the following schedule:

63	schedule is entitled to the length of service increases set forth in section one-a of this article.
64	Conservation officers in service at the time the amendment to this section becomes
65	effective In applying the salary schedules set forth in this section where salary increases are
66	provided for length of service, conservation officers in service at the time the schedules become
67	effective shall be given credit for prior service and shall be paid salaries as the same length of
68	service will entitle paid salaries the same length of service entitles them to receive under the
69	provisions of this section.

(c) This section does not apply to special or emergency conservation officers appointedunder the authority of section one of this article.

- 72 (d) Nothing in this section prohibits other pay increases as provided for under section two,
- 73 article five, chapter five of this code: *Provided*, That any across-the-board pay increase granted
- 74 by the Legislature or the Governor will be added to, and reflected in, the minimum salaries set
- 75 forth in this section; and that any merit increases granted to an officer over and above the annual
- 76 salary schedule listed in subsection (b) of this section are retained by an officer when he or she
- 77 advances from one rank to another.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide an increase in compensation for conservation officers.
