#### INTRODUCED H.B.

2016R2390

A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
designated §33-12B-11b, relating to providing civil immunity to company insurance
adjusters employed by an insurer from personal liability for claims of unfair trade practices;
and providing that the immunity does not exempt company adjusters from requirements
or responsibilities as a licensed adjuster.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

- 1 That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted by adding
- 2 thereto a new section, designated §33-12B-11b, to read as follows:

### ARTICLE 12B. ADJUSTERS.

### §33-12B-11b. Prohibiting certain civil actions against company adjusters.

- 3 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision in this code to the contrary, a cause of action does
- 4 not arise and a claim may not be brought against a company adjuster employed by an insurer
- 5 and a company adjuster employed by an insurer may not be named individually as a defendant
- 6 or be held personally liable in any civil lawsuit or cause of action in a court of law for civil damages
- 7 arising out of his or her involvement in adjusting a claim or for any other act or omission in violation
- 8 of article eleven, chapter thirty-three of this code while acting under the authority of his or her
- 9 employer or in the course and scope of his or her employment.
- 10 (b) This section does not exempt an individual from any other duties or responsibilities as
- 11 <u>a company adjuster licensed pursuant to this article or from any other provisions of this code as</u>
- 12 <u>a licensed company adjuster.</u>

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide civil immunity to company insurance adjusters employed by an insurer from personal liability for claims of unfair trade practices; and providing that the immunity does not exempt company adjusters from requirements or responsibilities as a licensed adjuster.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
