A BILL to repeal §29-20-2, §29-20-3, §29-20-4, §29-20-5 and §29-20-6 of the Code of West
Virginia, 1931, as amended; and to amend and reenact §29-20-1 of said code, all relating
to termination of the Women's Commission.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §29-20-2, §29-20-3, §29-20-4, §29-20-5 and §29-20-6 of the Code of West Virginia,
1931, as amended, be repealed; and that §29-20-1 of said code be amended and reenacted, all
to read as follows:

ARTICLE 20. WOMEN'S COMMISSION.

§29-20-1. Membership; appointment and terms of members; organization; reimbursement for expenses.

1 The West Virginia commission on the status of women is hereby abolished, and there is 2 hereby continued within the Department of Health and Human Resources the West Virginia 3 women's commission, to consist of eighteen members, seven of whom shall be ex officio 4 members, not entitled to vote: The Attorney General, the state superintendent of Schools, the 5 commissioner of labor, the commissioner of the bureau of human resources of the Department of 6 Health and Human Resources, the director of the Human Rights Commission, the director of the 7 Division of Personnel and the chancellor of the board of directors of the state college system. 8 Each ex officio member may designate one representative employed by his or her department to 9 meet with the commission in his or her absence. The Governor shall appoint the additional eleven 10 members, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, from among the citizens of the state. 11 The Governor shall designate the chairman and vice chairman of the commission and the 12 commission may elect such other officers as it deems necessary. The members shall serve a 13 term beginning July 1, 1977, three to serve for a term of one year, four to serve for a term of two 14 years and the remaining four to serve for a term of three years. The successors of the members 15 initially appointed as provided herein shall be appointed for a term of three years each in the same 16 manner as the members initially appointed under this article, except that any person appointed to

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- 17 fill a vacancy occurring prior to the expiration of the term for which his or her predecessor was 18 appointed shall be appointed for the remainder of such term. Each member shall serve until the 19 appointment and qualification of his or her successor. 20 No member may receive any salary for his or her services, but each may be reimbursed 21 for actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of his or her duties out of funds 22 received by the commission under section four of this article, except that in the event the expenses 23 are paid, or are to be paid, by a third party, the members shall not be reimbursed by the 24 commission The Women's Commission is declared to be terminated and shall not exist after June 25 30, 2018. Pursuant to the provisions of sections twelve and thirteen, article ten, chapter four of 26 this code, this board shall wind up its affairs, arrange for the disposition of its funds, assets, equipment and records, and cease all activities within the time periods established in those 27
- 28 sections.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to terminate the Women's Commission and discontinue its functions.
