1	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
2	designated §20-2-5i, relating to and prohibiting the waste of game animals, game birds or
3	game fish and creating a misdemeanor with criminal penalties for the violation thereof.
	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
	ARTICLE 2. WILDLIFE RESOURCES.
	§20-2-5i. Waste of game animals, game birds, or game fish; penalties.
1	(a) A person may not waste a game animal, game bird, or game fish (hereinafter referred
2	to as "game") that has been wounded, killed, or taken while hunting or fishing. This section does
3	not apply to fur-bearing animals and woodchucks or groundhogs. For purposes of this section,
4	<u>"waste" means:</u>
5	(1) To detach or remove only the head, hide, feet, paws, claws, antlers, tusks, gall bladder,
6	or teeth or any or all of these parts from the carcass of game;
7	(2) To detach or remove only the feathers, fan, beard, or spurs or any or all of these parts
8	from game;
9	(3) To intentionally dispose of or abandon any portion of game suitable for food in the
10	fields or woods or about the streams of the state;
11	(4) To leave wounded or killed game in the fields or woods or about the streams of the
12	state without making a reasonable effort to retrieve and render it for consumption or use: Provided,
13	That nothing in this subsection shall be construed as requiring any person to retrieve wounded
14	game if such retrieval would constitute a violation of section seven of this article; or
15	(5) To transport, store, or hang the carcass of game in a manner that renders it unfit for
16	human consumption.
17	(b) Any person violating the provisions of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon
18	conviction thereof, shall be subject to the following penalties:
19	(1) With respect to big game as defined in section two, article one of this chapter, a fine of
20	not less than \$500 nor more than \$2,500, or confined in jail not less than ten days nor more than

- one hundred days, or both fined and confined. Additionally, the person shall be subject to the
 applicable forfeiture provisions set forth in section five-a of this article. Further, the person's
 hunting and fishing licenses shall be suspended for five years.
- 24 (2) With respect to all other game a fine of not less than \$100 nor more than \$1,000, or confined in jail not less than ten days nor more than one hundred days, or both fined and confined.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to prohibit the waste of game animals, game birds, or game fish.
