Senate Bill 247

1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
 2 designated §61-2-7a, relating to making it a felony to attempt to kill another person; and
 3 establishing a penalty.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 2. CRIMES AGAINST THE PERSON.

§61-2-7a. Attempt to kill; penalty.

1 Notwithstanding any provision in this code to the contrary, with the exception of §61-2-7
 2 of this code, if any person commits any act with intent to kill another person, he or she is guilty of
 3 a felony and, upon conviction, shall be confined in a state correctional facility not less than three
 4 nor more than fifteen years.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to make it a felony to attempt to kill another person. The bill establishes a penalty.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
