A BILL to amend and reenact §18B-10-1a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating generally to in-state residency tuition rates; providing that members of a reserve unit in West Virginia shall qualify as residents for purposes of calculating tuition rates; striking the requirement that members of the National Guard participate in the National Guard education services program; and providing that current members of the United States armed forces shall qualify as residents for purposes of calculating tuition rates.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 10. FEES AND OTHER MONEY COLLECTED AT STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION.

§18B-10-1a. Resident tuition rates for National Guard members of the National Guard, Reserve and Armed Forces.

- (a) The term "resident" or "residency", or any other term or expression used to designate a West Virginia resident student, when used to determine the rate of tuition to be charged students attending community colleges and state-related and state-owned institutions of higher education shall be construed to include the following:
- (1) Members of the National Guard or Reserve who are not residents of West Virginia but who are active members of a National Guard or Reserve unit in West Virginia; who are participating in the National Guard education services program and
 - (2) Current members of the United States Armed Forces who reside in West Virginia.
- (b) A member of the National Guard who qualifies as a resident A person who qualifies as a resident, as that term is defined in subsection (a) of this section, on the first day of the semester or term of the college or institution, shall be charged resident tuition rates.
- (c) The provisions of this section apply at the beginning of the semester or term immediately following the effective date of this section.
