A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
designated §17C-5-2c, relating to creating the new criminal offense of impaired operation
of a motor vehicle placing nonpassengers at risk of physical injury; clarifying that offense
is separate and distinct from operating a motor vehicle under the influence; and
establishing penalties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

#### **ARTICLE 5. SERIOUS TRAFFIC OFFENSES.**

#### §17C-5-2c. Endangering persons by impaired operating of a motor vehicle.

- 1 (a) Any person who, while operating a motor vehicle in violation of the provisions of §17C-
- 2 <u>5-2 of this code, places a nonpassenger at risk of physical injury, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor</u>
- 3 and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than \$500 nor more than \$1,000, confined in
- 4 jail for not more than one year, or both fined and confined.
- 5 (b) A violation of the provisions of this section is a separate and distinct offense from a
- 6 violation of §17C-5-2 of this code.
