commercial motor vehicle in a commission of a felony involving "severe forms of trafficking

#### ARTICLE 1. COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSE.

#### §17E-1-14b. Lifetime ban for commercial drivers involved in human trafficking.

A commercial driver using a commercial motor vehicle in a commission of a felony

involving an act or practice of "severe forms of trafficking in persons" as that term is defined and

described in 22 U.S.C. §7102(11) is disqualified for life of holding a Commercial Driver's License.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to prohibit a commercial driver who has used a commercial motor vehicle in a commission of a felony involving "severe forms of trafficking in persons" from holding a commercial driver's license for life.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
