- A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
 designated §61-6-26, relating to unlawful panhandling and solicitation; exempting fire
- 3 departments; and providing misdemeanor penalties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 6. CRIMES AGAINST THE PEACE.

§61-6-26. Unlawful panhandling and solicitation; fraudulent solicitation prohibited.

- 1 (a) For purposes of this section, "panhandling" means any solicitation made in person
- 2 requesting an immediate donation of money. The purchase of an item for an amount far exceeding
- 3 its value, under circumstances where a reasonable person would understand that the purchase
- 4 is, in substance, considered a donation.
- 1 (b) No person may panhandle:
- 2 (1) At a bus stop or train stop;
- 3 (2) In a public transportation vehicle or facility:
- 4 (3) In a vehicle on the street;
- 5 (4) On private property, unless the panhandler has written permission from the owner or

6 occupant of the private property; or

- 7 (5) On any street, sidewalk, public right-of-way or public property by:
- 8 (A) Blocking the path of the person being asked for a donation;
- 9 (B) Following a person who walks away from the panhandler; or
- 10 (C) Making any statement, gesture or other communication by which the panhandler
- 11 knowingly causes another to believe that the panhandler will cause physical harm to the person
- 12 or property of the other person.
- 13 (c) Upon a first offense, a person violating the provisions of this section is guilty of a
- 14 misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined \$100. Upon a second or subsequent violation

15 of the provisions of this section, a person is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall

16 <u>be fined not less than \$250 nor more than \$1,000.</u>

17 (d) A bona fide fire department is exempt from the provisions of §61-6-26(b) of this code

18 when soliciting donations to support its operation.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to make certain acts of panhandling and solicitation unlawful. The bill exempts fire departments. The bill provides misdemeanor penalties.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
