- A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
  designated §11-21-12m, relating to providing taxpayers a deduction for interest paid on
  qualified education loans to the extent such amount is not allowable as a deduction when
- 4 arriving at a taxpayer's federal adjusted gross income

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

### ARTICLE 21. PERSONAL INCOME TAX.

#### §11-21-12m. Deduction for student Loan Interest.

- 1 (a) In addition to amounts authorized to be subtracted from federal adjusted gross income
- 2 pursuant to §11-21-12(c) of this code, any interest paid by the taxpayer during the taxable year
- 3 on any qualified education loan is also an authorized modification reducing federal adjusted gross
- 4 income, but only to the extent the amount is not allowable as a deduction when arriving at the
- 5 <u>taxpayer's federal adjusted gross income for the taxable year in which the payment is made.</u>
- 6 (b) For purposes of this section, the term "qualified education loan" has the same meaning
- 7 as the term qualified education loan in 26 U.S.C. §22(d)(1).
- 8 (c) Rules The Tax Commissioner may propose legislative rules, or promulgate
- 9 interpretive or procedural rules, as the commissioner deems unnecessary to carry out the
- 10 provisions of this section and to provide guidelines and requirements to ensure uniform
- 11 administrative practices statewide to effect the intent of this section. All rules shall be promulgated
- 12 in accordance with the provisions of §29A-3-1 et seq. of this code.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide a deduction for interest paid on qualified education loans to the extent such amount is not allowable as a deduction when aiming at a taxpayer's federal adjusted gross income.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
