A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
designated §15-10-7, relating to cooperation between law-enforcement personnel and
military authorities.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 10. COOPERATION BETWEEN LAW-ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES.

§15-10-7. Cooperation with Military Authorities.

- 1 The head of any law-enforcement agency, or the head of any campus police, as those
- 2 terms are defined in §15-10-3 of this code, will temporarily provide assistance, cooperation, and
- 3 information to the National Guard of this state or of another state for any actions taken for the
- 4 primary purpose of assisting the National Guard in investigatory matters related to National Guard
- 5 personnel regardless of incidental benefits to civil authorities: *Provided*, That no National Guard

6 request shall be used to circumvent the restrictions and limitations set forth in the Posse

- 7 Comitatus Act, § 18 U.S.C. 1385. Actions under this provision may include:
- 8 (1) Investigations and other actions related to enforcement of the Uniform State Code of
- 9 Military Justice, West Virginia Code, Chapter 15, Section 1E or the state code of military justice
- 10 of the National Guard of another state or territory.
- 11 (2) Investigations and other actions involving National Guard personnel, regardless of
- 12 whether there is a related civil or criminal proceeding.
- 13 (3) Investigations and other actions related to reports of sexual assault or sexual
- 14 <u>harassment involving National Guard personnel, to include any cases of reprisal or retaliation.</u>
- 15 (4) Investigations and other actions related to a commander's inherent authority to
- 16 maintain law and order on a National Guard installation or facility.
- 17 (5) Protection of classified defense information or equipment or controlled unclassified
- 18 information.
- 19 (6) Protection of National Guard, equipment, and official guests.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to enhance cooperation between civilian law enforcement and military authorities.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
