A BILL to amend and reenact §36-8-9 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating generally to public notice of unclaimed property held by the State Treasurer; eliminating the requirement that the Treasurer publish the unclaimed property registry in newspapers; requiring the Treasurer to publish a searchable database of persons appearing to be the owners of unclaimed property, to be updated every six months; requiring the Treasurer to publish an annual advertisement regarding unclaimed property in a newspaper of general circulation in certain counties; and setting forth required content for said advertisement.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 8. UNIFORM UNCLAIMED PROPERTY ACT.

§36-8-9. Notice and publication of lists of abandoned property.

- (a) The administrator shall publish a notice not later than November 30, of the year next following the year in which abandoned property has been paid or delivered to the administrator. The notice must be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the county of this state in which is located the last known address of any person named in the notice. If a holder does not report an address for the apparent owner, or the address is outside this state, the notice must be published in the county in which the holder has its principal place of business within this state or another county that the administrator reasonably selects. The advertisement must be in a form that, in the judgment of the administrator, is likely to attract the attention of the apparent owner of the unclaimed property.
 - (1) The form notice must contain:
- (1) (A) The name of each person appearing to be the owner of the property, as set forth in the report filed by the holder;
- (2) (B) The last known address or location of each person appearing to be the owner of the property, if an address or location is set forth in the report filed by the holder;
- (3) (C) A statement explaining that property of the owner is presumed to be abandoned and has been taken into the protective custody of the administrator; and

17	(4) (D) A statement that information about the property and its return to the owner is
18	available to a person having a legal or beneficial interest in the property, upon request to the
19	administrator.
20	(2) The administrator is not required to advertise the name and address or location of an
21	owner of property having a total value less than \$50 or information concerning a traveler's check,
22	money order, or similar instrument.
23	(3) Beginning January 1, 2023, the requirements of this subsection n are terminated and
24	shall have no effect.
25	(b) At least four times per year, at regular intervals, the administrator shall publish an
26	advertisement in a newspaper of general circulation in each county of this state notifying readers
27	that the administrator holds unclaimed property and that the reader might be entitled to claim
28	unclaimed property in the administrator's custody.
29	(1) The advertisement required by this subsection must provide the following information:
30	(A) A brief description of the types of property that are commonly held by the administrator;
31	(B) Instructions for accessing the searchable database of unclaimed property on the
32	administrator's website; and
33	(C) Instructions for requesting information regarding unclaimed property from the
34	administrator by telephone or by mail.
35	(2) The advertisement required by this subsection must be in a form that, in the judgment
36	of the administrator, is likely to attract the attention of the apparent owner of the unclaimed
37	property.
38	(c) The administrator shall maintain an database the administrator's website that is
39	accessible by the public and electronically searchable which contains the names reported to the
40	administrator of all apparent owners for whom property is being held by the administrator:
41	Provided, That (b) The administrator is not required to advertise include in the database the name
42	and address or location of an owner of property having a total value less than \$50 or information

43 concerning a traveler's check, money order, or similar instrument.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to eliminate the requirement that the Treasurer publish a full list of unclaimed property in newspapers and instead require that information be included in a publicly available online database.
