### **Senate Bill 720**

1 A BILL supplementing, amending, and increasing items of existing appropriation from the State  
 2 Road Fund to the Department of Transportation, Division of Motor Vehicles, fund 9007,  
 3 fiscal year 2021, organization 0802, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021.

1 WHEREAS, The Governor submitted to the Legislature the Executive Budget Document,  
 2 dated February 10, 2021, which included a statement of the State Road Fund setting forth  
 3 therein the cash balances and investments as of July 1, 2020, and further included the estimate  
 4 of revenues for the fiscal year 2021, less regular appropriations for the fiscal year 2021; and

5 WHEREAS, It appears from the Statement of the State Road Fund there now remains  
 6 an unappropriated balance in the State Treasury which is available for appropriation during the  
 7 fiscal year ending June 30, 2021; therefore

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

1 That the total appropriation for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021, to fund 9007, fiscal  
 2 year 2021, organization 0802, be supplemented and amended by increasing existing items of  
 3 appropriation as follows:
