1	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
2	designated §55-7-32, relating to authorizing civil damages for any person who was subject
3	to an intentionally false report made to law enforcement that results in harm to the person
4	subject to the report.
	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
	ARTICLE 7. ACTIONS FOR INJURIES.
	§55-7-32. False reporting to law enforcement; civil remedy.
1	(a) A person may bring a civil action for damages against any person who knowingly
2	causes a law-enforcement police officer to arrive at a location to contact another person with the
3	intent to:
4	(1) Infringe on the other person's rights under the West Virginia or United States
5	Constitution:
6	(2) Unlawfully discriminate against the other person;
7	(3) Cause the other person to feel harassed, humiliated or embarrassed;
8	(4) Cause the other person to be expelled from a place in which the other person is lawfully
9	located; or
10	(5) Damage the other person's:
11	(A) Reputation or standing within the community; or
12	(B) Financial, economic, consumer or business prospects or interests.
13	(b) Upon prevailing in an action under this section, the plaintiff may recover the greater of:
14	(1)(A) Special and general damages, including damages for emotional distress; or
15	(B) Statutory damages of \$250 against each defendant found liable under this section;
16	and
17	(2) Punitive damages.
18	(c) The court may award reasonable attorney fees to the prevailing plaintiff in an action
19	under this section.

#### 20 (d) A civil action under this section does not affect a right or remedy available under any

#### 21 <u>other law of this state.</u>

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to allow for a civil damages for any person who was subject to an intentionally false report made that results in the appearance of a law enforcement officer and that results in harm to the person subject to the report.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
