1	A BILL to amend the code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
2	designated §29-6-4a, all relating to required information for job postings; defining terms;
3	requiring the Division of Personnel to compensation information within job postings; and
4	requiring state agencies to provide certain compensation information to the Division of
5	Personnel.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 6. CIVIL SERVICE SYSTEM.

§29-6-4a. Information required for all job postings in the classified service.

- 1 (a) The following terms are defined as follows:
- 2 (1) "Direct compensation" means base salary and incentives that are provided regularly
- 3 and consistently.
- 4 (2) "Indirect compensation" means any noncash benefit provided to an employee,
- 5 including, but not limited to:
- 6 (A) Health insurance;
- 7 (B) Dental insurance;
- 8 (C) Vision insurance;
- 9 (D) Life insurance;
- 10 (E) Disability income protection;
- 11 (F) Retirement benefits:
- 12 (G) Employer student loan contributions or other employee assistance programs;
- 13 (H) Educational benefits;
- 14 <u>(I) Childcare;</u>
- 15 (J) Relocation benefits; and
- 16 (K) Annual leave, sick leave, and any other form of paid time-off.
- 17 (3) "Total compensation statement" means a list of direct and indirect compensation
- 18 provided or offered for a position, including an itemized list of the types of compensation provided

- 19 or offered and a cumulative total of the value of all compensation provided or offered.
- 20 (b) The Division of Personnel shall provide a total compensation statement for all
- 21 advertisements or postings for positions within the classified service.
- 22 (c) Each agency, division, department, board, or commission whose positions are within
- 23 the classified service shall provide, on forms created by the division, all direct and indirect
- 24 <u>compensation information.</u>

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is regarding required information for job postings; defining terms; requiring the Division of Personnel to provide compensation information within its job postings; and requiring state agencies to provide certain compensation information to the Division of Personnel.
