A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article,
designated §16-20-1, §16-20-2, and §16-20-3, all relating to prohibiting discrimination in
eligibility for organ transplantation based upon an individual's COVID-19 vaccine status.
Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 20. NONDISCRIMINATION IN ACCESS TO ORGAN TRANSPLANTATION.

§16-20-1. Findings and assurances.

1 (1) Organ transplant centers must consider medical and psychosocial criteria when

2 determining if a patient is suitable to receive an organ transplant. Organ transplant centers that

- 3 participate in Medicare, Medicaid, and other federal funding programs are required to use patient
- 4 selection criteria that result in a fair and nondiscriminatory distribution of organs; and
- 5 (2) West Virginia residents in need of organ transplants are entitled to assurances that
- 6 they will not encounter discrimination on the basis on their COVID-19 vaccine status.

§16-20-2. Definitions.

- 1 <u>As used in this article:</u>
- 2 (1) "Anatomical gift" means a donation of all or part of a human body to take effect after

3 the donor's death for the purpose of transplantation or transfusion.

- 4 <u>(2) "Covered entity" means:</u>
- 5 (A) Any licensed provider of health care services, including licensed health care
- 6 practitioners, hospitals, nursing facilities, laboratories, intermediate care facilities, psychiatric

7 residential treatment facilities, institutions for individuals with intellectual or developmental

- 8 disabilities, and prison health centers; or
- 9 (B) Any entity responsible for matching anatomical gift donors to potential recipients.
- 10 <u>"Organ transplant" means the transplantation or transfusion of a part of a human body into the</u>
- 11 body of another for the purpose of treating or curing a medical condition.
- 12 (3) "Qualified individual" means an individual who, notwithstanding his or her decision to
- 13 receive the COVID-19 vaccine, meets the essential eligibility requirements for the receipt of an

14 <u>anatomical gift.</u>

§16-20-3. Discrimination prohibited.

1 (a) A covered entity may not, solely on the basis of a qualified individual's choice to receive

- 2 the COVID-19 vaccine:
- 3 (1) Deem an individual ineligible to receive an anatomical gift or organ transplant;
- 4 (2) Deny medical and related services related to organ transplantation, including
- 5 evaluation, surgery, counseling, post-operative treatment and services;
- 6 (3) Refuse to refer the individual to a transplant center or other related specialist for the
- 7 purpose of evaluation or receipt of an organ transplant;
- 8 (4) Refuse to place an individual on an organ transplant waiting list, or placement of the

9 individual at a lower-priority position on the list than the position at which he or she would have

- 10 <u>been placed if not for his or her disability; or</u>
- 11 (5) Decline insurance coverage for any procedure associated with the receipt of the
- 12 <u>anatomical gift, including post-transplantation care;</u>
- 13 (b) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, a covered entity may take an individual's
- 14 vaccine status into account when making treatment and/or coverage recommendations or
- 15 decisions, solely to the extent that the COVID-19 vaccine has been found by a physician or
- 16 surgeon, following an individualized evaluation of the potential recipient, to be medically
- 17 significant to the provision of the anatomical gift. The provisions of this section shall not be
- 18 deemed to require referrals or recommendations for, or the performance of, medically
- 19 inappropriate organ transplants.
- 20 (c) If an individual has the necessary support system to assist the individual in complying
- 21 <u>with post-transplant medical requirements, an individual's inability to independently comply with</u>
- 22 those requirements shall not be deemed to be medically significant for the purposes of subsection
- 23 (b) of this section.
- 24 (d) The provisions of this section apply to each part of the organ transplant process.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to prohibit discrimination, based on an individual's mental or physical disability, in access to organ transplantation.
