A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
 designated §21A-10-23; relating to authorizing the Commissioner of Workforce West
 Virginia to create an unemployment compensation insurance fraud unit; establishing
 training requirements; specifying duties; and granting certain authorities necessary to
 conduct investigations into alleged unemployment insurance fraud.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 10. GENERAL PROVISIONS.

<u>§21A-10-23. Creation of Unemployment Compensation Insurance Fraud Unit; purpose;</u> <u>duties; and personnel qualifications.</u>

1 (a) There is established the West Virginia Unemployment Compensation Insurance Fraud 2 Unit within the offices of the commissioner. The commissioner may employ full-time supervisory, 3 legal, and investigative personnel for the unit who shall be gualified by training and experience in the areas of detection, investigation, or prosecution of fraud. The director of the unit is a full-time 4 5 position and shall be appointed by the commissioner and serve at his or her will and pleasure. 6 The commissioner shall provide office space, equipment, and supplies, and shall employ and train 7 personnel, including legal counsel, investigators, auditors, and clerical staff necessary for the unit to carry out its duties and responsibilities under this article as the commissioner determines is 8 9 necessary. 10 (b) It is the duty of the unit to: 11 (1) Initiate inquiries and conduct investigations when the unit has cause to believe 12 violations of any provisions of West Virginia Code Chapter 21A, West Virginia Unemployment 13 Compensation Insurance Law: 14 (2) Review reports or complaints of alleged fraud related to the business of unemployment compensation insurance activities from federal, state, and local law-enforcement and regulatory 15

16 agencies, persons engaged in the business of insurance and the general public to determine

17 <u>whether the reports require further investigation;</u>

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18	(3) Conduct independent examinations of alleged fraudulent activity related to the		
19	business of unemployment compensation insurance and undertake independent studies to		
20	determine the extent of fraudulent insurance acts; and		
21	(4) Perform any other duties related to the purposes of this article assigned to it by the		
22	commissioner.		
23	(c) The commissioner, or the commissioner's designee, may issue investigatory		
24	subpoenas and/or subpoenas duces tecum for witnesses and documents relevant to an		
25	investigation, including information concerning the existence, description, nature, custody,		
26	condition, and location of any book, record, documents, or other tangible items and the identity		
27	and location of persons having knowledge of relevant facts or any matter reasonably calculated		
28	to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence.		
29	The unit may:		
30	(1) Inspect, copy, or collect records and evidence;		
31	(2) Administer oaths and affirmations;		
32	(3) Share records and evidence with federal, state, or local law-enforcement or regulatory		
33	agencies, and enter into interagency agreements. For purposes of carrying out investigations		
34	under this article, the unit shall be considered a criminal justice agency under all federal and state		
35	laws and regulations and as such shall have access to any information that is available to other		
36	criminal justice agencies concerning violations of the unemployment compensation insurance		
37	laws of West Virginia or related criminal laws;		
38	(4) Make criminal referrals to the county prosecutors;		
39	(5) Conduct investigations outside this state. If the information the unit seeks to obtain is		
40	located outside this state, the person from whom the information is sought may make the		
41	information available to the unit to examine at the place where the information is located. The unit		
42	may designate representatives, including officials of the state in which the matter is located, to		
43	inspect the information on behalf of the unit, and may respond to similar requests from officials of		

44	other	states;

- 45 (d) Specific personnel of the unit designated by the commissioner may operate vehicles
 46 owned or leased for the state displaying Class A registration plates:
- 47 (e) Notwithstanding any provision of this code to the contrary, specific personnel of the
- 48 <u>unit designated by the commissioner may carry firearms in the course of their official duties after</u>
- 49 meeting specialized qualifications established by the Governor's Committee on Crime,
- 50 Delinquency, and Correction, which shall include the successful completion of handgun training
- 51 provided to law-enforcement officers by the West Virginia State Police: Provided, That nothing in
- 52 this subsection shall be construed to include any person designated by the commissioner as a
- 53 law-enforcement officer as that term is defined by the provisions of §30-29-1 of this code; and
- 54 (f) The unit is not subject to the provisions of §6-9A-1 et seq. of this code and the
- 55 investigations conducted by the unit and the materials placed in the files of the unit as a result of
- 56 any such investigation are exempt from public disclosure under the provisions of §29B-1-1 et seq.
- 57 of this code.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize the commissioner of Workforce West Virginia to create an unemployment compensation insurance fraud unit. The bill establishes training requirements; specifies duties; and grants certain authorities necessary to conduct investigations into alleged unemployment insurance fraud.
