1	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia 1931, as amended, by adding thereto four new
2	sections, designated §33-62-1, §33-62-2, §33-62-3, and §33-62-4, all relating to dental
3	health care service plans; providing for transparency of expenditures of patient premiums;
4	requiring carriers to file annual reports; requiring annual rebates to patients if funds spent
5	for patient care is less than a certain percentage of premium funds; and requiring
6	legislative and emergency rules.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 62. MEDICAL LOSS RATIOS FOR DENTAL HEALTH CARE SERVICES PLANS.

§33-62-1. Definitions.

1 <u>For purposes of this article:</u>

- 2 (a) "Commissioner" means the Insurance Commissioner of this state.
- 3 (b) "Dental carrier" or "carrier" means a dental insurance company, dental service

4 <u>corporation, dental plan organization authorized to provide dental benefits, or a health benefits</u>

- 5 plan that includes coverage for dental services.
- (c) "Dental health care service plan" or "plan" means any plan that provides coverage for
 dental health care services to enrollees in exchange for premiums, and does not include plans
- 8 <u>under Medicaid or CHIP.</u>
- 9 (d) "Medical loss ratio" or "MLR" means the minimum percentage of all premium funds
- 10 collected by an insurer for dental insurance plans each year that must be spent on actual patient
- 11 care rather than overhead costs, administration, and other expenses.

§33-62-2. Transparency of patient premium expenditures.

(a) A carrier that issues, sells, renews, or offers a specialized dental health care service
 plan contract shall file a Medical Loss Ratio (MLR) annual report with the commissioner that is
 organized by market and product type and contains the same information required in the 2013

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4	federal Medical Loss Ratio (MLR) Annual Reporting Form (CMS-10418).				
5	(b) The MLR reporting year shall be for the fiscal year during which dental coverage is				
6	provided by the plan. All terms used in the MLR annual report shall have the same meaning as				
7	used in the federal Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. Sec. 300gg-18), Part 158 (commencing				
8	with 158.101) of Title 45 of the Code of Federal Regulations, and Section 1367.003.				
9	(c) If data verification of the carrier's representations in the MLR annual report is deemed				
10	necessary, the commissioner shall provide the carrier with a notification 30 days before the				
11	commencement of the financial examination.				
12	(d) The carrier shall have 30 days from the date of notification to submit to the				
13	commissioner all requested data. The commissioner may extend the time for a health care service				
14	plan to comply with this subdivision upon a finding of good cause.				
15	(e) The commissioner shall make available to the public all data provided to the				
16	commissioner pursuant to this section.

- 15 fiscal year following the year for which the ratio described in subsection (a) of this section was

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<u>§33-62-4.</u>	Rulemaking.		
(a) On or before	June 28, 2023, the com	missioner shall propose	rules for legislative

2 approval in accordance with the provisions of §29A-3-1 et seq. of this code to effectuate the

- 3 provisions of this article.
- 4 (b) On or before May 1, 2023, the commissioner shall promulgate emergency rules
- 5 pursuant to the provisions of §29A-3-15 of this code to effectuate the provisions of this article.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide for transparency of the expenditure of dental health care plan premiums, and to require annual reports and rebates to patients if the medical loss ratio exceeds a certain percentage.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
