A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article, designated §18-10R-1, §18-10R-2, §18-10R-3, §18-10R-4, §18-10R-5, §18-10R-6, §18-10R-7, §18-10R-8, §18-10R-9, §18-10R-10, §18-10R-11, §18-10R-12, §18-10R-13, §18-10R-14, §18-10R-15, §18-10R-16, and §18-10R-17, all relating to creating a Statewide Online Education Program to enable eligible students to earn high school graduation credit through the completion of publicly funded online courses.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

<u>ARTICLE. 10R. STATEWIDE ONLINE EDUCATION PROGRAM.</u>

§18-10R-1. Definitions.

- 1 As used in this article: 2 "District school" means a public school under the control of a county school board. 3 "Eligible student" means: (A) A student enrolled in a county school or charter school in West Virginia; or 4 5 (B) Beginning on July 1, 2023, a student: 6 (i) Who attends a private school or home school; and 7 (ii) Whose custodial parent or legal guardian is a resident of West Virginia. 8 "LEA" means a local education agency in West Virginia that has administrative control and 9 direction for public education. 10 "Online course" means a course of instruction offered by the Statewide Online Education 11 Program using digital technology. 12 "Primary LEA of enrollment" means the LEA in which an eligible student is enrolled for 13

 "Released-time" means a period during the regular school day a student is excused from

(a) In addition to offering online courses to students through the Statewide Online

Education Program, a school district or charter school may enter into an agreement with another

school district or charter school or a consortium of school districts or charter schools to provide

online instruction to the school district's or charter school's students.

(b) Online instruction offered pursuant to subsection (a) of this section is not subject to the

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to create a Statewide Online Education Program to enable eligible students to earn high school graduation credit through the completion of publicly funded online courses.
