1	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
2	designated §7-1-3uu, relating to requiring county commissions to impose a Health and
3	Safety Fee of \$1.00 per day or activity per person for tourism and recreational activities;
4	listing applicable activities; and defining collection by the county and state, providing
5	distribution timelines to the counties, and requirements for use of the funds disbursed.
	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
	ARTICLE 1. COUNTY COMMISSIONS GENERALLY.
	§7-1-3uu. Health and Safety Fee.
1	(a) Every county commission shall collect a \$1.00 Health and Safety Fee per person per
2	activity/day for the following tourism and recreation activities:
3	(1) Hotel/Motel/Cabin/Condominium/Airbnb/VRBO rentals;
4	(2) RV or tent camping fees;
5	(3) Car rental;
6	(4) Boat rental;
7	(5) Boat rides;
8	(6) ATV/motorcycle/bicycle rental;
9	(7) Bus excursions/charter (this shall be per person per day);
10	<u>(8) Ski lift usage;</u>
11	(9) Whitewater rafting;
12	(10) Guided fishing or hunting excursions;
13	(11) Zip line, rock climbing, paddle boarding, and similar outdoor adventure activities;
14	(12) Carnival, fair, or amusement park visits;
15	(13) Train rides;
16	(14) Museum or historical home tours;
17	(15) Concerts or music festivals;
18	(b) The County Commissions for each county shall provide these funds to the state for

- 19 <u>accounting quarterly;</u>
- 20 (c) The State shall return the funds collected by each county semi-annually;
- 21 (d) The monies returned to the county semi-annually must be earmarked specifically for
- 22 use in emergency services readiness, and to be divided equally among EMS and fire departments.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to create a statewide Health and Safety Fee that would allow visitors to help contribute to the readiness cost of emergency services through a \$1.00 per day/activity fee that would be distributed to the counties twice per year.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
