## Senate Bill 48

A BILL to amend and reenact §18A-4-2b of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating
 to making school psychologists holding a license in school psychology from the West
 Virginia Board of Examiners of Psychologists eligible for the same annual salary
 supplement and expense reimbursements that school psychologists who attain national
 professional certification by the National Association of School Psychologists are eligible
 for; and removing obsolete language.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 4. SALARIES, WAGES AND OTHER BENEFITS.
 §18A-4-2b. State minimum salary supplement and educational expense reimbursement for professional personnel with recognized national certification in speech-language pathology, audiology, counseling, school psychology or school nursing.

1 (a) (1) The Legislature finds that achieving a nationally recognized professional 2 certification in speech-language pathology or audiology involves a rigorous process of 3 demonstrating both knowledge and skills and results in highly trained and capable employees. 4 Individuals who attain national professional certification by the American Speech-Language-5 Hearing Association provide needed and essential services to the school students of this state. 6 Individuals should be encouraged to achieve and maintain the national professional certification 7 through reimbursement of expenses and a salary bonus which reflects their additional 8 certification.

9 (2) The Legislature finds that the rigorous standards and processes for advanced 10 certification by either the National Board of Certified Counselors or the West Virginia Board of 11 Examiners in Counseling helps to promote the quality of counseling in schools. Counselors in the 12 public schools of West Virginia should be encouraged to achieve and maintain the advanced 13 certification through reimbursement of expenses and a salary bonus that reflects their additional 14 certification.

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(3) The Legislature finds that achieving a nationally recognized professional certification in

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16 school psychology or a license in school psychology from the West Virginia Board of Examiners of 17 Psychologists involves a rigorous process of demonstrating competencies in scientific research-18 based knowledge and skills. School psychologists provide assessment, counseling and 19 consultation to students, teachers, school administrators and parents. Individuals who attain 20 national professional certification by the National Association of School Psychologists or a license 21 in school psychology from the West Virginia Board of Examiners of Psychologists provide services 22 to students, families, and school systems in this state. School psychologists should be 23 encouraged to achieve and maintain this national professional certification or this state license 24 through reimbursement of expenses and a salary bonus which reflects their additional 25 certification.

26 (4) The Legislature finds that achieving a nationally recognized professional certification in 27 school nursing involves a rigorous process of demonstrating competencies in health care and 28 nursing applications, knowledge, and skills. School nurses provide assessment, counseling and 29 consultation to students, teachers, school administrators and parents. School nurses who attain 30 national professional certification by the National Board for Certification of School Nurses provide 31 services to students, families, and school systems in this state. School nurses should be 32 encouraged to achieve and maintain this national professional certification through 33 reimbursement of expenses and a salary bonus which reflects their additional certification.

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(5) Therefore, the purpose of this section is:

(A) To provide a statewide salary supplement for certain professional personnel employed
 in the public schools who hold nationally recognized professional certification in speech-language
 pathology, audiology, counseling, school psychology, er school nursing or other credential as
 provided in this section;

39 (B) To treat these professional certifications equally;

40 (C) To encourage others to attain such a certification; and

41 (D) To help school systems recruit these highly qualified professionals.

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42 (b) In addition to any amounts prescribed in the applicable state minimum salary schedule,

43 any professional personnel who hold national certification or other credential as provided in this

- section shall be paid an annual salary supplement of \$2,500. The payment is:
- 45 (1) To be made in equal monthly installments;
- 46 (2) To be considered a part of the state minimum salaries for teachers; and

47 (3) To continue for the life of the certification, or for 10 years for any one certification,48 whichever first expires.

49 (c) Professional personnel employed as speech-language pathologists, audiologists, 50 counselors, school psychologists or school nurses are eligible upon enrollment for reimbursement 51 for one-half of the fee for certification in accordance with this section. In addition, these personnel 52 are eligible upon attainment of the certification for reimbursement of the remainder of the 53 application fee plus other expenses actually incurred toward attainment of the certification, not 54 exceeding \$600, upon approval by the Department of Education. Not more than 115 speech-55 language pathologists, audiologists, counselors, school psychologists and school nurses, 56 combined total, are eligible for reimbursement in any one fiscal year.

57 (d) Notwithstanding subsection (b) of this section, for the school year beginning July 1, 58 2008, the number of speech-language pathologists, audiologists, counselors, school 59 psychologists and school nurses paid the annual salary supplement provided for in said 60 subsection may not exceed the number of speech-language pathologists, audiologists and 61 counselors eligible to be paid the annual salary supplement under the provisions of this section in 62 effect during the school year beginning July 1, 2007, by more than one hundred fifteen gualified 63 recipients, and the The total amount number of qualified recipients to be paid the annual salary 64 supplement pursuant to this section may not increase thereafter by more than 115 in each 65 subsequent fiscal year.

(e) The state board shall promulgate a legislative rule establishing criteria for selection of
the individuals eligible for reimbursement and a salary supplement in accordance with this section.

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68	The selection criteria shall prioritize the length of time the certification has been held and the years
69	of experience of the holder in determining eligibility.
70	(f) The state board shall report the rule to the Legislative Oversight Commission on
71	Education Accountability by the January, 2009, legislative interim meeting period and shall report
72	on its progress in developing the rule to the commission during prior interim meetings as
73	requested
74	(g) (f) No provision of this section may be construed to require any appropriation, or any
75	specific level of appropriation, by the Legislature, or payment of any supplement or reimbursement
76	described in this section for which a specific appropriation has not been made.
77	(h) (g) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section or the provisions of section two-a

of this article, professional personnel may not be paid a salary supplement pursuant to theprovisions of both said sections.
