CS for SB 484

A Bill to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended; and by adding thereto a new section
designated §61-10-35, relating to creating the criminal offense of human smuggling;
defining terms; clarifying that each person smuggled constitutes a separate offense;
acknowledging prohibition against police action based on race or ethnic origin; and
establishing criminal penalties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 10. CRIMES AGAINST PUBLIC POLICY.

§61-10-35. Human smuggling; definitions; penalties.

1 (a) Any person, who for a commercial purpose, knowingly and willfully transports or

2 <u>facilitates the transport of persons in this state, whom he or she knows or has reason to know is not</u>

3 lawfully present in the United States, is guilty of human smuggling.

4 (b) Any person who commits human smuggling where the person smuggled is 18 years of

5 age or older is guilty of a felony and upon conviction thereof, shall be imprisoned in a state

6 corrections facility, for not less than one nor more than five years, or fined not more than \$200,000

7 or both imprisoned and fined.

8 (c) Any person who commits human smuggling where the persons smuggled are younger

9 than 18 years of age is guilty of a felony and upon conviction thereof shall be imprisoned in a state

10 correctional facility, for not less than two nor more than 10 years, or fined not more than \$300,000,

- 11 <u>or both imprisoned and fined.</u>
- 12 (d) Each person smuggled as defined in this section constitutes a separate, and distinct
- 13 <u>offense.</u>
- 14 (e) Nothing in this section may be construed to authorize or warrant persons being stopped
- 15 or detained pursuant to this section based solely upon race or ethnic origin.
- 16 (f) As used in this section:
- 17 (1) "Commercial purpose" means the charging or receiving a monetary fee or other thing of
- 18 <u>value.</u>

- 19 (2) "Facilitating" means aiding and abetting human smuggling by such means as providing
- 20 travel and lodging arrangement services, the means of transportation, or false identification
- 21 <u>documents.</u>
- 22 (3)"Human smuggling" means the provision of a service including providing
- 23 transportation, false identification documents, or transient housing to a person who voluntarily
- 24 <u>seeks to gain illegal entry into the United States.</u>
