A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
designated §18-2-44, relating to the teaching of divisive acts and critical race theory in
West Virginia schools; providing definitions; prohibiting public schools and charter schools
from teaching or training students to believe certain divisive concepts; allowing a teacher
to be dismissed or not re-employed for teaching or training students to believe certain
divisive concepts; providing certain construction; providing for promulgation of rules;
providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 2. STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

§18-2-44. Curriculum promoting "divisive acts" and "critical race theory" prohibited.

1 (a) As used in this section

- 2 (1) "Divisive concepts" means the concepts that:
- 3 (A) One race or sex is inherently superior to another race or sex;
- 4 (B) The United States is fundamentally racist or sexist;
- 5 (C) An individual, by virtue of his or her race or sex, is inherently racist, sexist or
- 6 <u>oppressive</u>, whether consciously or unconsciously;
- 7 (D) An individual should be discriminated against or receive adverse treatment solely or
- 8 partly because of his or her race or sex;
- 9 (E) Members of one race or sex cannot and should not attempt to treat others without
- 10 <u>respect to race or sex;</u>
- 11 (F) An individual's moral character is necessarily determined by his or her race or sex;
- 12 (G) An individual, by virtue of his or her race or sex, bears responsibility for actions
- 13 committed in the past by other members of the same race or sex;
- 14 (H) Any individual should feel discomfort, guilt, anguish or any other form of psychological
- 15 distress on account of his or her race or sex;
- 16 (I) Meritocracy or traits such as a hard work ethic are racist or sexist or were created by a

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17	particular race to oppress another race; or
18	(J) Any other form of race or sex stereotyping or any other form of race or sex
19	scapegoating.
20	(2) "Race or sex stereotyping" means ascribing character traits, values, moral and ethical
21	codes, privileges, status or beliefs to a race or sex, or an individual because of his or her race or
22	sex; and
23	(3) "Race or sex scapegoating" means assigning fault, blame or bias to a race or sex or to
24	members of a race or sex because of their race or sex. It also includes any claim that consciously
25	or unconsciously and by virtue of his or her race or sex, members of any race are inherently racist
26	or are inherently inclined to oppress others, or that members of a sex are inherently sexist or
27	inclined to oppress others.
28	(b) Public school districts and public charter schools in this state shall be prohibited from
