1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article, 2 designated §16-67-1, establishing the food desert program under the Department of 3 Agriculture.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

1	(a) The Department of Agriculture shall establish a two-year program to provide residents				
2	of food desert communities with access to fresh and affordable produce. In establishing the				
3	program, the department shall select one or more partnering providers to establish weekly				
4	markets in three food desert communities, one of which shall be located in a rural area, in order to				
5	make fruits and vegetables more affordable to families and individuals with limited access to fresh				
6	food.				
7	(b) The department shall:				
8	(1) Solicit and select a partnering provider that demonstrates the ability to reliably provide a				
9	consistent, year-round supply of reasonably priced fresh fruits and vegetables to serve food desert				
10	<u>communities;</u>				
11	(2) Work with food desert communities to identify and recruit a partnering provider to				
12	establish weekly markets, which may be operated in partnership with local public schools,				
13	community organizations, or nonprofit organizations; and				
14	<u>(3) Enga</u>	ge in appropriate	outreach efforts v	vith food desert commun	ities, the agricultural
15	industry, and the	public concerning	<u>g the availability o</u>	f the program.

23	recipes for use of the produce; and		
24	(5) Donate any surplus produce at the end of each market to food banks, food pantries,		
25	soup kitchens, and other nonprofit organizations that distribute food to individuals in need located		
26	in the state.		
27	(d) Within two years after the date of enactment of this act, the department shall submit a		
28	written report to the Legislature, summarizing the program established pursuant to this section;		
29	identifying the partnering providers and food desert communities participating in the program, as		
30	well as the number of families and individuals served by the markets, and the amount of food		
31	vouchers redeemed at the markets; and providing recommendations for legislative actions to		
32	expand access to, and the affordability of, fruits and vegetables to residents in food desert		
33	communities throughout the state.
