A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section, designated §18B-1-12, relating to providing tuition fees at an institution of higher education for certain persons, who are not yet residents, at the rate for residents of the state; and providing requirements to be met by these persons before qualified for resident tuition rates, based upon employment by a business or organization that is established in this state as part of a program under the Economic Development Act of 1985.
