A BILL to amend and reenact §9-2-4 of the Code of West Virginia, as amended, relating to the
establishment of a division of forensic social work services within the Department of Health
and Human Resources.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 2. COMMISSIONER OF HUMAN SERVICES <u>HEALTH AND HUMAN</u> <u>RESOURCES</u>; POWERS, DUTIES, AND RESPONSIBILITIES GENERALLY. §9-2-4. Organization of Department of Welfare <u>Health and Human Resources</u>.

1 (a) Within limits of state appropriations and federal grants and subject to provisions of state 2 and federal laws, rules and regulations, the Commissioner shall organize the department into such 3 offices, divisions, agencies and other administrative units, and, consistent with the requirements of 4 §29-6-1, *et seq.* of this code, shall appoint and employ for the department such deputies, 5 assistants and employees, as may in his judgment be necessary or desirable to carry out fully and 6 in an orderly, efficient and economical manner the powers, duties and responsibilities of the 7 department and of his office.

- 8 (b) The commissioner shall establish the division of forensic social work services within the
- 9 department, to ensure the department will have a trained and skilled workforce to provide timely
- 10 and effective social work services for the department in and for circuit courts and administrative
- 11 bodies of the state. The division shall use its own personnel, equipment, and facilities provided by
- 12 <u>the department.</u>

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to establish the division of forensic social work services within the Department of Health and Human Resources.
