16	(b) The s	signed and exe	ecuted shared animal owner	ship agreement	shall be filed by the herd
17	seller with the C	Commissioner	of Agriculture and shall cor	ntain the names	, addresses, and phone

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20	(c) The herd seller shall meet the animal health requirements for milk-producing animals
21	established by the state veterinarian in accordance with state and national standards including the
22	following:
23	(1) Raw milk from milk-producing animals intended for consumption shall be from a here
24	that tested negative within the previous 12 months for brucellosis, tuberculosis, and other
25	diseases as required by the state veterinarian. Additions to the herd shall test negative for the
26	diseases within the previous 30 days before introduction into the herd; and
27	(2) Milk-producing animals producing bloody, stringy, or abnormal milk, but with only sligh
28	inflammation of the udder, shall be excluded from the milking herd until reexamination shows that
29	the milk has become normal. Milk-producing animals showing chronic mastitis, whether producing
30	abnormal milk or not, shall be permanently excluded from the milking herd.
31	(d) Parties to a shared animal ownership agreement and physicians who become aware o
32	an illness directly related to consuming raw milk shall report the illness to the local health
33	department and the Commissioner of Agriculture. Upon receipt of such a report, the
34	Commissioner of Agriculture or his or her designee shall contact and warn other parties
35	consuming raw milk from the same herd seller.
36	(e) The Commissioner of Agriculture may impose an administrative penalty not to exceed
37	\$100 for a person who violates the provisions of this section. Any penalty imposed under this
38	subsection may be contested by the person against whom it is imposed pursuant to §29A-5-1 e
39	seq. of this code.
40	(f) The Commissioner of Agriculture, in consultation with the Department of Health and
41	Human Resources, may propose rules for promulgation in accordance with the provisions o
42	§29A-3-1 et seq. of this code in compliance with raw milk dairy industry standards.

(g) Notwithstanding any provision of code to the contrary, raw milk may be sold without the

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45	(1) As an ingredient in the preparation or making of a nonedible product, such as a soap or
46	lotion; or
47	(2) As feed for another animal: Provided, That the sale of raw milk to be used as animal
48	feed is subject to the provisions of §19-14-1 et seq. of this code
49	(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of the law to the contrary, sales of raw milk are
50	permitted in West Virginia as long as the containers are clearly labeled as ungraded raw milk, with
51	the name of the seller and the date of production.
52	(b) A person who sells raw milk shall be immune from suit and liability, for a claim for
53	personal injury or other civil liability caused or arising out of, or relating to, an actual or alleged act,
54	error, or omission that occurred: Provided, That a person is not protected from suit or liability for
55	damage, loss, injury, or liability caused by the intentional or willful and wanton misconduct.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to permit the sale of raw milk in West Virginia.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
