A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article,
designated §27-18-1, §27-18-2, §27-18-3, §27-18-4, §27-18-5, and §27-18-6, all relating
to establishing the behavioral health reform and innovation council; declaring the title of the
act; creating the council; describing the scope of the council; detailing the composition of
the council; requiring meetings and setting certain rules for the meetings; stating powers
and duties of the council; and defining subcommittees of the council.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

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ARTICLE 18. BEHAVIORAL HEALTH REFORM AND INNOVATION COUNCIL. §27-18-1.

This Article shall be known as the Behavioral Health Reform and Innovation Act.

§27-18-2. Creating Behavioral Health Reform and Innovation Council. There is hereby created the West Virginia Behavioral Health Reform and Innovation Council for the purpose of conducting a comprehensive review of the behavioral health system in West Virginia. Such review shall include the behavioral health services and facilities available in this state, the identification of behavioral health issues in children, adolescents, and adults, the impact of the behavioral health system on public safety and emergency services personnel, the impact of the behavioral health system on the court system and correctional system, the barriers and challenges of the mental hygiene process and transitions in and out of involuntary commitment, the legal and systemic barriers to treatment of mental illnesses, workforce shortages that impact the delivery of care, whether there is sufficient access to behavioral health services and supports and the role of payers in such access, the impact on how untreated behavioral illness can impact children into adulthood, the impact of behavioral health on the state's substance use problem; and the impact of behavioral illness on the state's homeless population.

As used in this article, the term "council" means the West Virginia Behavioral Health

Reform and Innovation Council.

§27-18-3. Composition of council and administration.

1	(a) The council shall be composed of 25 members as follows:
2	(1) The following members appointed by the Governor:
3	(A) A psychiatrist who specializes in children and adolescents;
4	(B) A psychiatrist who specializes in adults;
5	(C) A health care provider with expertise in traumatic brain injuries;
6	(D) A chief medical officer of a mental health facility;
7	(E) A school psychologist or school counselor;
8	(F) A forensic psychologist;
9	(G) A faith-based community leader;
10	(H) A homeless service provider;
11	(I) A professional who specializes in substance abuse and addiction; and
12	(J) A representative of a local board of public health;
13	(2) The following members appointed by the President of the Senate:
14	(A) Two members of the Senate;
15	(B) A county official that is not a county commissioner;
16	(C) A licensed clinical behavioral health professional;
17	(D) A behavioral health advocate; and
18	(E) A mayor of a municipality;
19	(3) The following members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates:
20	(A) Two members of the House of Delegates;
21	(B) A county commissioner;
22	(C) A licensed clinical behavioral health professional;
23	(D) A behavioral health advocate; and
24	(E) A municipal official that is not a mayor; and
25	(4) The following members appointed by the Chief Justice of the West Virginia Supreme

26	Court of Appeals:			
27	(A) Two circuit court judges, at least one of whom has experience in operating a specialty			
28	court; and			
29	(B) A mental hygiene commissioner.			
30	(b) Each nonlegislative member of the council shall be appointed to serve for a term of two			
31	years or until his or her successor is duly appointed. Legislative members of the council shall serve			
32	until completion of their current terms of office. Any member may be appointed to succeed himself			
33	or herself on the council. If a member of the council is an elected or appointed official, such			
34	member, or his or her designee, shall be removed from the council if such member no longer			
35	serves as such elected or appointed official.			
36	(c) The following members shall serve as nonvoting ex officio members of the council:			
37	(1) Commissioner of the Bureau for Behavioral Health, within the Department of Health			
38	and Human Resources, or his or her designee;			
39	(2) Director of the Division of Juvenile Justice, within the West Virginia Department of			
40	Military Affairs and Public Safety, or his or her designee;			
41	(3) Director of the Division of Corrections and Rehabilitation, within the West Virginia			
42	Department of Military Affairs and Public Safety, or his or her designee;			
43	(4) Commissioner of the Bureau for Public Health, within the Department of Health and			
44	Human Resources, or his or her designee;			
45	(5) Director of the Division of Probation Services, within the West Virginia Supreme Court			
46	of Appeals, or his or her designee;			
47	(6) Superintendent of the West Virginia State Police, or his or her designee; and			
48	(7) Director of the Bureau of Children and Families, within the Department of Health and			
49	Human Resources, or his or her designee.			
50	(d) The council shall elect a chairperson and may elect other officers, as it deems			
51	necessary.			

52	(e) The c	ouncil shall be attache	d for administrative p	urposes only to the West V	<u>irginia</u>	
53	Legislature's Joint Committee on Government & Finance. The Joint Committee on Government &					
54	Finance shall provide staff support for the council. The Joint Committee on Government & Finance					
55	shall use any funds specifically appropriated to it to support the work of the council.

1	(a) The co	ouncil may conduct mee	etings at such places a	and times as it deems necess	ary or	
2	convenient to enable it to fully and effectively exercise its powers, perform its duties, and					
3	accomplish the objectives and purposes of this article. The council shall hold meetings at the call					
4	of the chairperson. The council shall meet not less than twice every year.					
5	(b) A quorum for transacting business shall be a majority of the members of the council.					
6	(c) Members of the council shall receive no compensation for their services on the council					
7	but may be reimbursed for expenses incurred by them in the performance of their duties as					
8	members of the	council. The funds nec	essary for the reimbu	rsement of the expenses of	state	
9	officials and state employees shall come from funds appropriated to or otherwise available to their					
10	respective departments. All other funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this article shall					
come from funds appropriated to the Joint Committee on Government & Finance.

12	(1) To evaluate how the laws, rules, regulations, policies, and programs affecting the				
13	behavioral health system in this state are working;				
14	(2) To request and receive data from and review the records of appropriate state agencies				
15	and courts to the greatest extent allowed by state and federal law;				
16	(3) To accept public or private grants, devises, and bequests;				
17	(4) To authorize entering into contracts or agreements through the council's chairperson				
18	necessary or incidental to the performance of its duties;				
19	(5) To establish rules and procedures for conducting the business of the council; and				
20	(6) To conduct studies, hold public meetings, collect data, or take any other action the				
21	council deems necessary to fulfill its responsibilities.				
22	(c) The council shall be authorized to retain the services of attorneys, consultants, subject				
23	matter experts, economists, budget analysts, data analysts, statisticians, and other individuals or				
24	organizations as determined appropriate by the council.				
	§27-18-6. Subcommittees.				
1	(a) The chairperson of the council shall appoint the following subcommittees from among				
2	the membership of the council and may also appoint up to two other noncouncil-member persons				
3	to each subcommittee as he or she may determine to be necessary as relevant to and consistent				
4	with this article:				
5	(1) Children and Adolescent Behavioral Health;				
6	(2) Involuntary Commitment;				
7	(3) Hospital and Short-Term Care Facilities;				
8	(4) Mental Health Courts and Corrections; and				
9	(5) Workforce and System Development.
