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A BILL to amend and reenact §30-6-8 and §30-6-9 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to modifying the education and apprenticeship requirements to obtain a license for funeral directors and embalmers.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 6. BOARD OF FUNERAL SERVICE EXAMINERS.

§30-6-8. Embalmer license requirements.

- 1 The board shall issue a license to practice embalming to an applicant who: 2 (a) Is free of a felony conviction bearing a rational nexus to the profession pursuant to §30-3 1-24 of this code; 4 (b) Is 18 years of age or over; 5 (c) Is a citizen of the United States or is eligible for employment in the United States; 6 (d) Has a high school diploma or its equivalent; 7 (e) Has completed one of the following education requirements, as evidenced by a 8 transcript submitted to the board for evaluation: 9 (1)(A) Has an associate degree from an accredited college or university; or 10 (2) Has successfully completed at least 60 semester hours or 90 quarter hours of 11 academic work in an accredited college or university toward a baccalaureate degree with a 12 declared major field of study; and 13 (3) Has graduated from a school of mortuary science, accredited by the American Board of 14 Funeral Service Education, Inc., which requires as a prerequisite to graduation the completion of a 15 course of study of not less than 12 months; or 16 (B) Has a bachelor degree in mortuary science from an accredited college or university; 17 (e) Has graduated from a school of mortuary science, accredited by the American Board of 18 Funeral Service Education, Inc., which requires as a prerequisite to graduation the completion of a 19 course of study of not less than 12 months;
 - (f) Has completed a one-year apprenticeship:

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21	(A) Under the supervision of a licensed embalmer and funeral director actively and lawfully
22	engaged in the practice of embalming and funeral directing in this state; which apprenticeship
23	consisted of <u>or</u>
24	(B) For a mortuary school for embalmers.
25	(1) Diligent attention to the work in the course of regular and steady employment and not
26	as a side issue to another employment; and
27	(2) The apprentice taking an active part in:
28	(A) The operation of embalming not less than 35 dead human bodies; and
29	(B) Conducting not less than 35 funeral services
30	(g) Passes, with an average score of not less than 75 percent, the following examinations:
31	(1) The International Conference of Funeral Service Examining Boards examination at a
32	testing site provided by the national conference, which passage is a condition precedent to taking
33	the state law examination;
34	(2) The West Virginia Laws, Rules, and Regulations Examination, administered by the
35	International Conference of Funeral Service Examining Boards; and
36	(3) Any other examination required by the board; and
37	(h) Has paid all the appropriate fees.
38	A license to practice embalming issued by the board prior to July 1, 2012, shall for all
39	purposes be considered a license issued under this section: Provided, That a person holding a
40	license issued prior to July 1, 2012, must renew the license pursuant to the provisions of this

	§30-6-9. Funeral director license requirements.
1	(a) The board shall issue a license to practice funeral directing to an applicant who meets
2	the following requirements:
3	(1) Completed a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution Has successfully
4	completed a program of study in Funeral Services Education consisting of not less than 30 hours

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5	from a school accredited by the American Board of Funeral Service Education and evidenced by
6	an official transcript; and
7	(2) Either completed a two-year apprenticeship under the supervision of a licensee in
8	charge or an active licensed funeral director; and or completed a one-year apprenticeship with a
9	mortuary school.
10	(3) Has paid all the appropriate fees; and
11	(b) The two-year apprenticeship must consist of the following work:
12	(1) Diligent attention to the work in the course, or regular and steady employment, and not
13	as a side issue to another employment;
14	(2) Conducting not less than 35 disposition arrangements for individuals;
15	(3) Conducting not less than 35 funeral and/or memorial services; and
16	(4) Passes with an average score of not less than 75 percent, the West Virginia Laws,
17	Rules, and Regulations Examination.
18	(c)(b) A license to practice funeral directing issued by the board prior to July 1, 2002, shall
19	for all purposes be considered a license issued under this section: <i>Provided</i> , That a person holding
20	a license issued prior to July 1, 2022, must renew the license pursuant to the provisions of this
21	article.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to modify the education and apprenticeship requirements to obtain a license for funeral directors and embalmers.
