## Senate Bill 435

By Senators Woodrum, Hamilton, and Woelfel

[Introduced January 12, 2024; referred

to the Committee on the Judiciary]

A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
designated §61-6-26, relating to DNA collection; defining terms; providing for penalties;
and providing for enforcement.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE	6.	CRIMES	AGA	AINST	THE	PEACE.
<u>§61-6-26.</u>	Collection	of	DNA	for	felony	convicts.

- 1 <u>(a) Definitions:</u>
- 2 (1) "DNA" means deoxyribonucleic acid.
- 3 (2) "CODIS" means the Combined DNA Index System.
- 4 (b) Any individual convicted of and sentenced for a felony crime shall provide authorities
- 5 with a DNA sample.
- 6 (c) The DNA collected from each person convicted of a felony shall be run against
- 7 evidence of other open cases and entered into CODIS.
- 8 (d) Any person who refuses to provide a DNA sample shall be guilty of a misdemeanor
- 9 and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than \$100.
- 10 (e) This section shall be enforced by all law enforcement officers within their respective
- 11 jurisdictions.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to collect DNA from those convicted of crimes to assist in solving other open criminal cases.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
