A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article,
designated §22-37-1, §22-37-2, §22-37-3, §22-37-4, §22-37-5, §22-37-6, §22-37-7, and
§22-37-8, all relating to authorizing the Division of Forestry to administer the Carbon
Exchange Program; outlining the scope of the Carbon Exchange Program; and providing
program requirements for the Carbon Exchange Program.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

	§22-37-4. Definitions.					
1	(a) "Carbon credit" means an emission reduction of one metric ton of carbon dioxide (or					
2	carbon dioxide equivalent) resulting from greenhouse gas emissions reductions or avoidance					
3	created by timber harvest restrictions or other silvicultural activities.					
4	(b) "Carbon credit agreement" means any contract for the sale or purchase of West Virginia					
5	carbon credits.					
6	(c) "Carbon dioxide equivalent" means the number of tons of carbon dioxide emissions					
7	with the same global warming potential as one ton of another greenhouse gas.					
8	(d) "Country of Particular Concern" means a country that has been designated as such by					
9	the Department of State of the United States of America pursuant to Section 408(a) of 22 USC					
10	<u>6448.</u>					
11	(e) "Division" means the Division of Forestry.					
12	(f) "Director" means the Director of the Division of Forestry.					
13	(g) "Greenhouse gas" means carbon dioxide, methane, nitrous oxide, or fluorinated gases.					
14	(h) "West Virginia carbon credit" means a Division-certified carbon credit that is generated					
15	in, or originates principally as a result of activity in, West Virginia.					
	§22-37-5. Scope; eligibility.					
1	(a) The Director shall, by July 1, 2025, establish the West Virginia Carbon Exchange on					
2	which all West Virginia carbon credits shall be listed. No carbon credit originating from real					
3	property or standing timber in West Virginia may be sold other than through the West Virginia					
4	Carbon Exchange.					
5	(b) The West Virginia Carbon Exchange shall regulate all West Virginia carbon credits and					
6	carbon credit agreements.					
7	(c) The West Virginia Carbon Exchange shall be a public marketplace open to businesses					

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8	and consumers alike: Provided, That all persons or businesses shall register with the Division				
9	before participating in the West Virginia Carbon Exchange.				
10	(d) West Virginia carbon credits that are created as a result of activities or restrictions on				
11	state property, including state forests and parks, are the property of the state, and may be sold as				
12	such.				
13	(e) Citizens of, or entities organized in or controlled by citizens or governments of, any				
14	country designated as a Country of Particular Concern by the Department of State of the United				
15	States of America are ineligible to register with the Division for the West Virginia Carbon				
16	Exchange.				
	§22-37-6. Program administration.				
1	(a) The West Virginia Carbon Exchange shall allow landowners and timber owners to				
2	publish West Virginia carbon credits on the Exchange for the solicitation of carbon credit				
3	agreements.				
4	(b) The West Virginia Carbon Exchange shall allow persons interested in purchasing West				
5	Virginia carbon credits to solicit offers for carbon credit agreements.				
6	(c) The Division shall certify carbon credits before their publication on the West Virginia				
7	Carbon Exchange.				
8	(d) Only West Virginia carbon credits are eligible for sale or purchase. The Division may				
9	keep a public catalog of available West Virginia carbon credits.				
10	(e) The West Virginia Carbon Exchange shall review all carbon credit agreements for				
11	compliance with the requirements of this article and associated regulations, including but not				
12	limited to:				
13	(1) Carbon credit certification criteria;				
14	(2) Price floors and ceilings; and				
15	(3) Contract term limits.				
16	(f) The Division may propose rules, including emergency rules, pursuant to §29A-3-1 et				

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17	seq. of this code to execute and implement the West Virginia Carbon Exchange, including					
18	adopting a fee schedule to fund the administration of the Exchange and setting standards for					
19	certification of carbon credits.					
20	(g) The Division may contract for services from third-party providers as necessary to					
21	execute, implement, and administer the West Virginia Carbon Exchange: Provided, That for					
22	purposes of this article, the Division shall be exempt from §5A-3-1 et seq. of this code.					
	§22-37-7. Appeals.					
1	Any person or business who disagrees with a decision of the Division, including, but not					
2	limited to, receipt of an adverse carbon credit certification decision or imposition of a condition of a					
3	carbon credit agreement, may file an appeal in accordance with the provisions of §29A-5-1 et seq.					
4	and §29A-6-1 et seq. of this code.					
	§22-37-8. Cooperation with other state agencies; reports to Legislature.					
1	(a) The Division shall cooperate with other state agencies to administer the West Virginia					
2	Carbon Exchange in the best interest of the state.					
3	(1) The West Virginia Geological and Economic Survey shall be available to provide its					
4	expertise and assistance.					
5	(2) The West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection shall be available to provide					
6	its expertise and assistance.					
7	(b) The Division shall submit an annual report on the impacts of the West Virginia Carbon					
8	Exchange to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Delegates, and the President of the					
9	Senate.
