A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
designated §30-3-21, relating to prohibiting certain medical practices; prohibiting medical
providers from performing pelvic, prostate, rectal, and breast exams on an anesthetized or
unconscious patient except in specified circumstances; and establishing an effective date.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 3. WEST VIRGINIA MEDICAL PRACTICE ACT.

18	(b) A pe	rson who violates this section is	guilty of sexual assault in the	second degree as

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defined in section §61-8B-4 of this code.

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(c) A person who violates this section is subject to suspension of his or her license or other				
authorization to practice medicine and surgery for no less than five years, including limiting the				
practice of that person to, or by the exclusion of, one or more areas of practice, including				
limitations on practice privileges.				
(d) A person who violates this section is subjected to a fine of no less than \$1,000 and no				

(d) A person who violates this section is subjected to a fine of no less than \$1,000 and no more than \$10,000 to be deposited into the West Virginia Foundation for Rape Information and Services.

(e) The provisions of this section are effective upon passage.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to prohibit certain medical practices; prohibit medical providers from performing pelvic, prostate, rectal, and breast exams on an anesthetized or unconscious patient except in specific circumstances; and establish an effective date.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
