# House Bill 2394

A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding a new section
designated §18-9F-9a, relating to requiring all schools in the state to implement a wearable
panic alert system to be known as Alyssa's law.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

#### ARTICLE 9F. SCHOOL ACCESS SAFETY ACT.

#### §18-9F-9a. Wearable panic alert system, "Alyssa's law".

1 (a) The state board in conjunction with the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency

2 Management shall promulgate by December 31, 2025, a legislative rule in accordance with §29A-

3 <u>3B-1 et seq.</u>, and if necessary may promulgate an emergency rule in accordance with that article,

- 4 <u>shall implement a wearable panic alert system, at every school in the state.</u>
- 5 (b) Each wearable panic alert system shall be capable of integrating with local public
- 6 safety answering point infrastructure to transmit 9-1-1 calls and mobile activations and initiating a
- 7 <u>campus-wide lockdown notification.</u>
- 8 (d) Each county board shall provide each staff person in a school facility with a wearable
- 9 panic alert device that allows for immediate contact with local emergency response agencies.
- 10 (e) Prior to the first day of school each year, each county board shall ensure that all school
- 11 <u>facility personnel receive training on the protocol for and appropriate use of the panic alert device.</u>
- 12 (f) Each county board shall ensure that all security data within a school facility is
- 13 accessible by a local law-enforcement agency and coordinate with the local law-enforcement
- 14 agency to establish appropriate access protocols. Accessible security data includes cameras,
- 15 <u>maps, and access control.</u>

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to implement a wearable panic alert system, to be known as Alyssa's law, in all schools in the state.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
