# House Bill 2491

1 A BILL to amending and reenacting §47-21A-1, §47-21A-2, §47-21A-3, §47-21A-4, §47-21A-5, 2 §47-21A-8, and §47-21A-13 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to 3 establishing that legislative intent that institutions of higher education have a need for 4 raising funds and granted the privilege of holding online raffles, relating to amending and 5 adding definitions relating to the allowance that institutions of higher education are subject 6 to this article, relating to allowing institutions of higher education to be authorized to 7 conduct certain online raffles without a license, relating to designating that an institution of 8 higher education may hold an online raffle, apply for a license including an annual license. 9 relating to striking the requirement that online charitable raffle licensees utilize a geo-10 location or geo-fencing technology licensee, relating to striking language that required a 11 licensee to maintain in the state of West Virginia its servers used to transmit information for 12 the purposes of patron participation, relating to providing that charitable online raffle 13 occasions are not considered as a sports wagering activity or an interactive wagering 14 activity, relating to gross proceeds from an institution of higher educations' charitable 15 online raffle occasion shall be exempt from certain taxes, relating to the expanded and 16 other information that institutions of higher education must provide in an application for a 17 license to conduct charitable online raffle occasions, and relating to the net proceed 18 disbursement that must occur for proceeds generated by an online charitable raffle 19 occasion conducted by an institution of higher education.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE21A.ONLINECHARITABLERAFFLES.§47-21A-1.Legislativeintent.

1 The Legislature, in recognition of the need for charitable and public service organizations. 2 <u>and institutions of higher education</u>, to have for a practicable way of raising funds by means of the 3 internet, declares its intent to grant the privilege of holding online raffles to those organizations as 4 provided in this article.

§47-21A-2. Definitions. 1 For purposes of this article, unless specified otherwise: 2 "Charitable or public service activity or endeavor" means any bona fide activity or endeavor 3 which directly benefits a number of people by: 4 (1) Contributing to educational or religious purposes; 5 (2) Relieving them from disease, distress, suffering, constraint, or the effects of poverty; 6 (3) Increasing their comprehension of, and devotion to, the principles upon which this 7 nation was founded and to the principles of good citizenship: 8 (4) Making them aware of, or educating them about, issues of public concern so long as the 9 activity or endeavor is not aimed at supporting or participating in the campaign of any candidate for 10 public office; 11 (5) Lessening the burdens borne by government or voluntarily supporting, augmenting, or 12 supplementing services which government would normally render to the people; 13 (6) Providing or supporting nonprofit community activities for youth, senior citizens, or the 14 disabled; 15 (7) Providing or supporting nonprofit cultural or artistic activities; 16 (8) Providing or supporting any political party executive committee; or 17 (9) Fostering national, collegiate, or international amateur sports competition. 18 "Charitable or public service organization" means a bona fide, not-for-profit, tax-exempt, 19 benevolent, educational, philanthropic, humane, patriotic, civic, religious, fraternal, or 20 eleemosynary, incorporated or unincorporated association, or organization; or a volunteer fire 21 department, rescue unit, or other similar volunteer community service organization or association; 22 but does not include any nonprofit association or organization, whether incorporated or not, which 23 is organized primarily for the purposes of influencing legislation or supporting or promoting the 24 campaign of any single candidate for public office.

25 "Commissioner" means the State Tax Commissioner.

"Conduct" means to direct the actual holding of an online raffle by activities including, but
not limited to, selling tickets, collecting money, drawing or arranging for the drawing of the winning
numbers or names, announcing the winning numbers or names, posting the winning numbers or
names, verifying winners, and awarding prizes.

30 "Expend net proceeds for charitable or public service purposes" means to devote the net 31 proceeds of an online raffle occasion or occasions to a qualified recipient organization or as 32 otherwise provided by this article and approved by the commissioner pursuant to §47-21A-13 of 33 this code.

34 "Gross proceeds" means all moneys collected or received from the conduct of an online35 raffle held by a licensee during a license period.

<u>"Institution of higher education" has the same meaning as contained in §21A-1A-21 of this</u>
 <u>code: Provided, That for purposes of this article an institution of higher education must have an</u>
 <u>athletic department that is governed by the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) and</u>
 <u>are designated by the NCAA as having a Division I or Division II athletics department.</u>

40 <u>"Institution of higher education's athletics department activity or endeavor" means any</u>
41 <u>bona fide activity or endeavor which directly benefits a number of people by providing broad</u>
42 <u>financial support to an institution of higher education's athletics department including all affiliated</u>
43 <u>and associated nonprofit corporations or other entities, trusts, or Name Image Likeness (NIL)</u>
44 <u>collectives.</u>

45 "Licensee" means any <u>institution of higher education, or charitable or public service</u>
46 organization or association granted an annual or limited occasion license pursuant to the
47 provisions of this article.

48 "Net proceeds" means all moneys collected or received from the conduct of an online raffle
49 or online raffles at occasions held by a licensee during a license period after payment of the online
50 raffle expenses authorized by §47-21A-11, §47-21A-12, and §47-21A-13 of this code.

51 "Person" means any individual, association, society, incorporated or unincorporated 52 organization, firm, partnership, or other nongovernmental entity or institution.

53 "Patron" means any individual who participates in an online raffle by purchasing an online
54 raffle ticket other than an individual who is participating in the conduct of the online raffle.

55 "Platform provider" means any third-party entity that contracts by written agreement with a
56 licensee to host, conduct, or otherwise administer an online raffle by using a software system, web
57 application, method, or other process for the purpose of conducting online raffles over the Internet.

"Qualified recipient organization" means any bona fide, not-for-profit, tax-exempt,
incorporated or unincorporated association or organization which is organized exclusively for
charitable or public services activities or endeavors.

61 "Online Raffle" has the same meaning as "raffle" as defined in §47-21-2 of this code but
62 conducted using a software system, web application, method, or other process for the purpose of
63 conducting online raffles over the Internet.

64 "Online raffle occasion" or "occasion" means a single online session at which a series of65 one or more successive online raffles is conducted by a single licensee.

66 "Tax-exempt association or organization" means an association or organization which is, 67 and has received from the Internal Revenue Service a determination letter that is currently in effect 68 stating that the organization is, exempt from federal income taxation under subsection 501(a) and 69 described in subsection 501(c)(3), 501(c)(4), 501(c)(8), 501(c)(10), 501(c)(19), or 501(d) of the 70 Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended; or is exempt from income taxes under subsection 71 527(a) of that code.

"Virtually Present" means live, real-time availability by online or other electronic means and
includes, but is not limited to, audio or video appearance or by an instant, live chat or messaging
program.

§47-21A-3. Authorizing the conduct of certain online raffles without a license.

1 Notwithstanding any other provisions of this article to the contrary, any charitable or public service organization, or institution of higher education, which has been in existence in this state for 2 3 at least one year may conduct online raffles without compliance with the licensing provisions of 4 this article: *Provided*, That any prize awarded in any single online raffle in an online raffle occasion 5 may not exceed in \$4,000 value: Provided, however, That the cumulative gross proceeds derived 6 from the conduct of online raffle occasions by the charitable or public service organization, or 7 institution of higher education, may not exceed \$15,000 during any calendar year: Provided 8 *further*, That the charitable or public service, or institution of higher education, are is not subject to 9 the record keeping provisions of §47-21A-14 of the code but shall maintain a separate accounting 10 for the operation of online raffles. All records required by this section shall be maintained for at 11 least three calendar years and shall be available for reasonable inspection by the commissioner.

#### §47-21A-4. Who may hold online raffles; application for license; licenses not transferable.

(a) Except as provided in §47-21A-3 of this code, only persons who are residents of this
state and who are active members of any charitable or public service organization, or is employed,
or contracted, by an athletic department of an institution of higher education, which has been in
existence in this state for at least two years prior to filing an application for an online raffle license
issued pursuant to §47-21A-5 and §47-21A-6 of the code may hold online raffle occasions in
accordance with the provisions of this article and only during the time it holds a valid license.

7 (b) The A charitable or public service organization, or an institution of higher education, 8 may applies apply for an online raffle license to the Tax Commissioner and the application shall be 9 on a form supplied by him or her. The application shall contain the information required by §47-21A-8 of the code and any other information which the commissioner considers necessary. An 10 11 online raffle may not be held and online raffle tickets may not be sold pursuant to this article until 12 the online raffle application has been approved by the Tax Commissioner and the license has been 13 received by the applicant: Provided, That an online raffle occasion may not be held and online 14 raffle tickets may not be sold until a 60-day filing period, which is that time period between the

15 receipt of that application by the Tax Commissioner and the first online raffle occasion, has 16 expired: Provided, however, That the Tax Commissioner shall send the applicant its license within 17 five days after the application is approved. If the 60-day filing period has expired and the 18 application has not been denied and the online raffle license has not been received by the 19 applicant, the applicant may consider the application approved and begin to sell tickets for the 20 online raffle or hold the online raffle occasion. The Tax Commissioner shall send the applicant its 21 license within five days after the expiration of the filing period if the application has not been 22 otherwise denied.

23 (c) An online raffle license issued pursuant to this article may not be transferred.

### §47-21A-5. Annual license; online raffle occasion not considered a sports wagering

activity; online raffle occasion not considered an interactive wagering activity; conditions holding of online raffles. on 1 (a) A charitable or public service organization, or institution of higher education, or any of 2 its auxiliaries, affiliated nonprofit corporations or other entities, trusts, collectives, or other 3 organizations otherwise affiliated with it, may apply for an annual license. Only one license per 4 year in the aggregate may be granted to a charitable or public service organization, or institution of 5 higher education, and all of its auxiliaries, affiliated nonprofit corporations or other entities, trusts, 6 collectives, or other associations or organizations otherwise affiliated with it: Provided, That for 7 purposes of this section, the various branches, chapters, or lodges of any national association or 8 organization or local churches of a nationally organized church are not considered affiliates or 9 auxiliaries of each other. The commissioner shall propose rules for legislative approval in 10 accordance with the provisions of §29A-3-1 et seq. of this code, to provide for the manner for 11 determining to which organization, whether the parent organization, an affiliate, or an auxiliary, the 12 one license allowed under this section is granted. An annual license is valid for one year from the date of issuance. Charitable or public service organizations, or institution of higher education, may 13 14 not hold a joint online raffle occasion under any annual licenses.

- (b) A licensee shall utilize geo-location or geo-fencing technology to ensure that online
  charitable raffles patrons are located in the state of West Virginia. A licensee shall maintain in the
  state of West Virginia its servers used to transmit information for the purposes of patron
  participation.
- (c) Any online raffle occasion, conducted by a licensee which holds an annual license and
   is an institution of higher education, shall not be considered as a sports wagering activity as
   contemplated in §29-22D-1 *et seq.* of this code.
- (d) Any online raffle occasion, conducted by a licensee which holds an annual license and
   is an institution of higher education, shall not be considered as an interactive wagering activity as
   contemplated in §29-22E-1 *et seg.* of this code.

(c) (e) The Tax Commissioner shall provide on his or her website a list of every active and
approved licensee to conduct an online raffle occasion. A licensee shall provide a conspicuous
hyperlink on any online raffle ticket that is purchased by a patron to the Tax Commissioner's
website. A licensee shall conspicuously display at its physical location, that was provided on its
application, the approved license to conduct an online raffle.

§47-21A-6. Limited occasion license; conditions on holding of online raffles.

(a) Two or more charitable or public service organizations, or institutions of higher
 <u>education</u>, may hold a joint online raffle occasion provided each participating organization has
 been granted a limited occasion online raffle license for the jointly held occasion: *Provided*, That a
 licensee which holds an annual license may not obtain more than one limited occasion license.

(b) A limited occasion license is valid only for the time period specified in the application
and entitles only the licensee to hold two online raffle occasions during the specified time period
which may not exceed six months from the date of issuance of the limited occasion license.

8 (c) Subject to the limitations set forth in this section for charitable or public service 9 organization<u>, or an institution of higher education</u> having an annual license, a charitable or public 10 service organization<u>, or an institution of higher education</u> and all of its auxiliaries or other

11 associations or organizations otherwise affiliated with it, including but not limited to any affiliated 12 nonprofit corporations or other entities, trusts, collectives, may be granted only three limited 13 occasion licenses per year in the aggregate. For purposes of this section the various branches, 14 chapters, or lodges of any national association or organization or local churches of a nationally 15 organized church are not considered affiliates or auxiliaries of each other. The commissioner shall 16 by rulemaking provide the manner for determining to which organization, whether the parent 17 organization, an affiliate, or an auxiliary, the three licenses allowed under this section are granted.

(d) The Tax Commissioner shall provide a hyperlink on its website that will display a list of
every active and approved licensee to conduct an online raffle occasion. A licensee shall provide
this hyperlink on any online raffle ticket that is purchased by a patron. A licensee shall
conspicuously display at its physical location, that was provided on its application, the approved
license to conduct an online raffle.

exemption §47-21A-7. License fee and from taxes. 1 (a) A license fee shall be paid to the Tax Commissioner for annual licenses in the amount of 2 \$500. A license fee shall be paid to the Tax Commissioner for a limited occasion license in the 3 amount of \$50. All revenue from the license fees shall be deposited in the special revenue account established under the authority of §11-9-2a of this code and used to support the investigatory 4 5 activities provided for in that section. The license fee imposed by this section is in lieu of all other 6 license or franchise taxes or fees of this state and a county or municipality or other political 7 subdivision of this state may not impose a license or franchise tax or fee on any online raffle or 8 online raffle occasion.

9 (b) The gross proceeds derived from the conduct of an online raffle occasion are exempt 10 from state and local business and occupation taxes, income taxes, excise taxes, and all special 11 taxes. Any charitable or public service organization, or institution of higher education conducting 12 an online raffle occasion pursuant to the provisions of this article is exempt from payment of 13 consumers sales and service taxes, use taxes, and all other taxes on all purchases for use or

14 consumption in the conduct of an online raffle occasion and is exempt from collecting consumers

15 sales taxes on any admission fees and sales of online raffle tickets.

7 (c) For a limited occasion license, the names and addresses of two or more bona fide 8 active members of the applicant organization who are charged with overall responsibility for the 9 applicant's online raffle operations, at least one of whom shall be virtually present and available 10 when the winning numbers or names are drawn, announced, posted, and verified and present 11 when the prizes are awarded: Provided, That an application submitted by an institution of higher 12 education shall contain the names and addresses of two or more employees of the institution of 13 higher education, or two or more persons contracted by the institution of higher education who are 14 charged with overall responsibility for the applicant's online raffle operations, at least one of whom 15 shall be virtually present and available when the winning numbers or names are drawn, 16 announced, posted, and verified and present when the prizes are awarded; and the names and 17 addresses of the highest elected officer of the licensee, if any, and his or her officially appointed designee, one of whom shall be virtually present and available when the winning numbers or 18 19 names are drawn, announced, posted, and verified and present when the prizes are awarded; for 20 an annual license, the names, addresses and telephone numbers of three or more bona fide active 21 members of the applicant organization who are charged with overall responsibility for the 22 applicant's online raffle operations, at least one of whom shall be virtually present and available 23 when the winning numbers or names are drawn, announced, posted, and verified and present

24 when the prizes are awarded: *Provided*. That an application submitted by an institution of higher 25 education shall contain the names and addresses of three or more employees of the institution of 26 higher education, or three or more persons contracted by the institution of higher education who 27 are charged with overall responsibility for the applicant's online raffle operations, at least one of 28 whom shall be virtually present and available when the winning numbers or names are drawn, 29 announced, posted, and verified and present when the prizes are awarded; and the names and 30 addresses and telephone numbers of the highest elected officer of the licensee, if any, and his or 31 her officially appointed designee, one of whom shall be virtually present and available when the 32 winning numbers and names are drawn, announced, posted, and verified and present when the 33 prizes are awarded;

34 (e) The address and the location of any platform provider that manages a website software 35 system, web application, method, or process for the purpose of collecting moneys related to the 36 sale of online raffles, securing and safekeeping all moneys collected related to the sale of online 37 raffle tickets, disbursing moneys collected from the sale of online raffle tickets to the licensee 38 before or after the online raffle or online raffle occasion, and conducting licensed online raffles over 39 the Internet. A copy of all written agreements between the licensee and the platform provider providing these services shall specifically provide a statement of all costs and fees to be incurred 40 41 by the licensee for receiving these services by the platform provider. A copy of any written 42 agreements shall be provided to the Tax Commissioner;

43 (f) Information required by the commissioner to satisfy him or her that the applicant meets44 the requirements of:

45 (1) Being a charitable or public service organization, or an institution of higher education as
46 defined by this article; and

47 (2) Being in existence in this state for at least one year prior to filing an application for an48 online raffle license.

(g) Designate the date or dates and the time or times when the online raffle occasions will
be held: *Provided*, That in addition to these initial disclosures of online raffle occasions an
institution of higher education shall provide to the commissioner a written list of online raffle
occasions that will occur each month, included in this list shall be a designation of the date or dates
and the time or times when the raffle occasions will be held;
(h) State whether the applicant has ever had a previous application for any online raffle or

raffle license refused, or whether any previous online raffle license or raffle license has been
revoked or suspended;

57 (i) State the charitable or public service, or institution of higher education's athletics
 58 <u>department's purpose</u>, <del>or</del> purposes, <u>activity or endeavor</u> for which the online raffle proceeds will be
 59 expended;

(j) Provide statements to the effect that the individuals specified in subdivision (c) of thissection and the officers of the applicant understand:

62 (1) That it is a violation of this article to allow any persons other than those authorized by63 this article to conduct the online raffle;

64 (2) That they are required to file the reports and keep the records as provided by this 65 article; and

66 (3) That it is a crime to violate the provisions of this article and that a violation of the 67 provisions may result in suspension or revocation of the online raffle license or other raffle license 68 and denial of applications for subsequent online raffle licenses or raffle licenses;

(k) Provide a sworn statement by an authorized representative of the applicant that the
 information contained in the application is true to the best of his or her knowledge;

(I) Provide a list and description of estimated expenses to be incurred in connection with
 the holding of the online raffle occasions and the name and address of each payee;

73 (m) A list of the names and addresses of all officers and members of the board of directors,

74 governors or trustees, and any employees of an institution of higher education's athletics

including, but not limited to:

75 department directly involved with online raffle occasions, if any, of the an applicant organizations; 76 and

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(n) Any other necessary and reasonable information which the commissioner may require. §47-21A-13. Payment of reasonable expenses from proceeds; net proceeds disbursement. 1 (a) The reasonable, necessary and actual expenses incurred in connection with the 2 conduct of online raffle occasions, not to exceed 40 percent of the gross proceeds collected during 3 a license period, may be paid out of the gross proceeds of the conduct of the online raffle,

5 (1) Rent paid for the use of any premises: *Provided*, That a copy of the rental agreement 6 was filed with the online raffle license application with any modifications to the rental agreement to 7 be filed within 10 days of being made: Provided, however, That in no event may the rent paid for 8 the use of any premises exceed the fair market value of rent for the premises;

9 (2) The cost to the licensee organization for equipment and supplies used to conduct the 10 online raffle occasion;

11 (3) The cost to the licensee organization for advertising the online raffle occasion;

12 (4) The costs involved in the licensee using technology. Internet service providers, servers, 13 or other necessary infrastructure by which to advertise and conduct the online raffle or online raffle 14 occasion;

15 (5) The costs relating to any platform provider that manages a website software system, 16 web application, method, or process for the purpose of collecting moneys related to the sale of 17 online raffles, securing and safekeeping all moneys collected related to the sale of online raffle 18 tickets, disbursing moneys collected from the sale of online raffle tickets to the licensee before or 19 after the online raffle or online raffle occasion, and conducting licensed online raffles over the 20 Internet.

21 (b) The actual cost to the licensee for prizes, not to exceed the amounts as specified in 22 §47-21A-11 of the code, may be paid out of the gross proceeds of the conduct of an online raffle.

23 (c) The licensee shall expend all net online raffle proceeds and any interest earned on the 24 net online raffle proceeds for the purposes stated in the application of an institution of higher 25 education, or for the purposes stated in the application of a charitable or public service purposes 26 organization, stated in the application within one year after the expiration of the license under 27 which the online raffle occasions were conducted. A licensee which does not gualify as a gualified 28 recipient organization may apply to the commissioner at the time it applies for an online raffle 29 license for permission to apply any or all of its net proceeds to directly support a charitable or 30 public service, or an institution of higher education's athletics department, activity or endeavor 31 which it sponsors.

(d) Gross proceeds from any online raffle occasion may not be devoted or in any manner
 used by any licensee or qualified recipient organization for the construction, acquisition, or
 improvement, of real or personal property except that which is used exclusively for one or more
 charitable or public service purposes or as provided in subsection (a) of this section.

36 (e) The Tax Commissioner may disapprove any contract for sale of goods or services to 37 any online raffle licensee for use in or with relation to any online raffle operation or occasion, or any 38 lease of real or tangible personal property to any online raffle licensee for use in or with relation to 39 any online raffle operation or occasion, if the contract or lease is unreasonable or not 40 representative of fair market value. Disapproved contracts or leases shall be considered to be in 41 contravention of this article, and are void. Any attempt by any online raffle licensee to engage in 42 transactions under the terms of any disapproved lease or contract is grounds for revocation or 43 suspension of the online raffle license or other charitable raffle license and for refusal by the Tax 44 Commissioner to renew the online raffle license or raffle license.

(f) Any licensee which, in good faith, finds itself unable to comply with the requirements of subsections (a) through (e) of this section shall apply to the commissioner for permission to expend its net proceeds for one or more charitable or public service, or institution of higher education purposes other than that stated in its license application or for permission to expend its

49 net proceeds later than the one-year time period specified in this section. The application shall be 50 on a form furnished by the commissioner and shall include the particulars of the requested 51 changes and the reasons for the changes. The application shall be filed no later than 60 days 52 before the end of the one-year period specified in this section. In the case of an application to 53 extend the time in which the net proceeds are to be expended for a charitable or public service 54 purpose <u>or for an institution of higher education's athletics department purpose</u>, the licensee shall 55 file periodic reports with the commissioner as directed until the proceeds are expended.
