A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article, designated §15A-14-1 and §15A-14-2, relating to transportation of inspected unauthorized aliens; defining the term "inspected unauthorized alien"; providing legislative findings; creating the Unauthorized Alien Transport Program within the Department of Homeland Security's Division of Administrative Services to facilitate the transport of inspected unauthorized aliens within the United States; authorizing the division to contract for services to implement the program; authorizing the division to adopt rules to implement the program; providing for future expiration.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

(a) As used in	this section, the term "ins	spected unauthorized alien" m	neans an individual
who has documentati	on from the United States	s Government indicating that	the United States
Government processe	ed and released him or h	er into the United States wit	thout admitting the
individual in accordance	ce with the federal Immigra	tion and Nationality Act, 8 U.S	.C. ss. 1101 et seq.
The term must be i	nterpreted consistently w	vith any applicable federal	statutes, rules, or
regulations.			
(b) The Legisla	ature finds that the Federa	al Government has failed to s	secure the nation's
borders and has allow	<u>ed a surge of inspected ur</u>	nauthorized aliens to enter the	United States.
(c) To mitigate	the effects of this surge of	inspected unauthorized alien	s on West Virginia,
the Unauthorized Alier	า Transport Program is crea	ated within the Division of Adm	inistrative Services
of the Department of I	Homeland Security for the	purpose of facilitating the train	nsport of inspected
unauthorized aliens wi	thin the United States, con	sistent with federal law. The di	vision is authorized
to contract for services to implement the program.			
§15A-14-2.	Rulemaking	authority;	expiration.

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- 1 (a) The division may adopt rules to implement the program.
- 2 (b) This article expires June 30, 2028.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to create the Unauthorized Alien Transport Program within the Department of Homeland Security's Division of Administrative Services to facilitate the transport of inspected unauthorized aliens within the United States.
