## House Bill 2720

A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section, designated §5B-2-22, relating to creating the Southern Coalfield Resiliency and Revitalization Program for a period of five years; finding that there are challenges facing the counties in which the southern coalfields are located; establishing revitalization council to organize and prioritize state resources and technical assistance for these counties; directing revitalization council to develop strategies to stimulate economic activity in and around the municipalities in Boone, Logan, McDowell, Mingo, and Wyoming counties in coordination with certain contributing partners to the extent possible; directing revitalization council to annually report to the Governor and the Legislature; directing Development Office and revitalization council to facilitate economic development incentives for the counties in which the southern coalfields are located; and authorizing Development Office or other state body to provide state property and equipment to businesses investing in the counties of the southern coalfield area of the state at a reduced cost.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 2. WEST VIRGINIA DEVELOPMENT OFFICE.

§5B-2-22. Southern Coalfield Resiliency and Revitalization Program.

(a) Definitions.—

- (1) General. Terms defined in this section have the meanings ascribed to them by this section, unless a different meaning is clearly required by either the context in which the term is used, or by specific definition in this section.
  - (2) Terms Defined. —
- (A) "Contributing partners" means those entities or their representatives described in subsection (f) of this section.
- (B) "Program" means the Southern Coalfield Resiliency and Revitalization Program established in this section.

10	(C) "Revitalization council" means those entities or their representatives described in
11	subsection (d) of this section.
12	(D) "Technical assistance" means resources provided by the state, revitalization council,
13	contributing partners or any other individuals or entities providing programming, funding, or other
14	support to benefit the counties in the Southern Coal field area of West Virginia under the program.
15	(E) "Southern Coalfield" means an area defined by the Development Office that
16	encompasses Boone, Logan, McDowell, Mingo, and Wyoming counties.
17	(F) "Southern Coalfield and Resiliency and Revitalization Program" means the entire
18	process undertaken to further the goals of this section, including collaboration development and
19	implementation between the members, contributors, and technical assistance resource providers.
20	(b) Legislative purpose, findings, and intent. —
21	(1) The impact of the diminishing coal industry on Boone, Logan, McDowell, Mingo, and
22	Wyoming counties has had a dramatic economic impact on the Southern Coalfield area of West
23	<u>Virginia.</u>
24	(2) The purpose of this section is to establish the Southern Coalfield Resiliency and
25	Revitalization Program. To further this purpose, this program creates a collaboration among state
26	government, higher education, and private and nonprofit sectors to streamline and increase
27	technical, agricultural, and economic assistance capacity, continue and increase existing services
28	and other resources to facilitate community revitalization in the southern coalfield area.
29	(3) It is the intent of the Legislature to identify existing state resources that can be
30	prioritized to support the counties of the southern coalfield area, generate thoughtful and
31	responsible ideas to mitigate the negative effects of the diminished coal industry, and help chart a
32	new course and prosperous future for the Southern Coalfield.
33	(c) Southern Coalfield Resiliency and Revitalization Program established; duration of
34	program. —
35	(1) The Development Office shall establish the Southern Coalfield Resiliency and

Revitalization Program in accordance with the provisions of this section, subject to the availability		
of funding necessary to support the program: Provided, That the department may not create any		
new positions or hire any additional employees to implement the provisions of this article. The		
program shall inventory existing assets and resources, prioritize planning and technical		
assistance, and determine such other assistance as might be available to revitalize communities		
in the counties in the southern coalfield area.		
(2) The program shall be established for an initial period of five years from the effective		
date of this legislation.		
(d) Revitalization council created. — There is hereby created a revitalization council to		
fulfill the purposes of this section. The revitalization council shall be coordinated by the		
Development Office in the Department of Commerce and be subject to oversight by the secretary		
of the department. The following entities shall serve as members of the revitalization council:		
(1) The Executive Director of the Development Office or their designee, who shall serve as		
chairperson of the council;		
(2) The Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Resources or their designee;		
(3) The Commissioner of the Department of Agriculture or their designee;		
(4) The Executive Director of the West Virginia Housing Development Fund or their		
designee;		
(5) A representative from the Boone County commission;		
(6) A representative from the Logan County commission;		
(7) A representative from the McDowell County commission;		
(8) A representative from the Mingo County commission;		
(9) A representative from the Wyoming County commission;		
(10)A representative from Southern West Virginia Community and Technical College;		
(11) A representative from West Virginia University;		
(12) A representative from Marshall University;		

62	(13) The County Directors of Economic Development from Boone County, Logan County,
63	McDowell County, Mingo County, and Wyoming County; and
64	(14) A representative from the Regional Planning and Development Councils
65	encompassing the five participating counties.
66	(e) Duties of the revitalization council. —
67	(1) The council shall identify existing state resources that can be prioritized to support
68	economic development efforts in the Southern Coalfield counties.
69	(2) The council shall direct existing resources in a unified effort and in conjunction with
70	contributing partners, as applicable, to support the Southern Coalfield counties.
71	(3) The council shall develop a rapid response strategy to attract or develop new
72	enterprises and job creating opportunities in the Southern Coalfield counties.
73	(4) The council shall conduct or commission a comprehensive assessment of assets
74	available at the reclaimed mine sites and abandoned industrial complexes and closed businesses
75	and determine how those assets will be preserved and repurposed.
76	(5) The council shall assist communities in the Southern Coalfield counties by developing
77	an economic plan to diversify and advance the communities.
78	(6) Members of the council shall support both the planning and implementation for the
79	program and shall give priority wherever possible to programmatic activity and discretionary,
80	noncompetitive funding during the period the program remains in effect.
81	(7) Members of the council shall work together to leverage funding or other agency
82	resources to benefit efforts to revitalize the Southern Coalfield counties.
83	(f) Contributing partners. — To the extent possible, the revitalization council shall
84	incorporate the resources and expertise of additional providers of technical assistance to support
85	the program, which shall include but not be limited to:
86	(1) The West Virginia Small Business Development Center;
87	(2) The Center for Rural Health Development;

88	(3) The West Virginia University Brickstreet Center for Entrepreneurship;
89	(4) The West Virginia University Land Use and Sustainability Law Clinic;
90	(5) The West Virginia University Center for Big Ideas;
91	(6) The WVU County Extension services;
92	(7) The Rahall Transportation Institute;
93	(8) The Marshall University Center for Business and Economic Research;
94	(9) West Virginia Small Business Association;
95	(10) The West Virginia Community Development Hub;
96	(11) The West Virginia University Northern Brownfields Assistance Center;
97	(12) West Virginia State University Extension Service;
98	(13) West Virginia University Extension Service, Community, Economic and Workforce
99	Development; and
100	(14) The President of West Virginia University Technical College.
101	(g) Reporting and agency accountability. — The revitalization council, in coordination with
102	its contributing partners, as applicable, shall report annually to the Governor and the Legislature
103	detailing the progress of the technical assistance support provided by the program, the strategic
104	plan for the Southern Coalfields counties and the results of these efforts.
105	(h) Economic Incentives for businesses investing in the Southern Coalfield counties. —
106	The Development Office and the revitalization council, as applicable, will work to educate
107	businesses investing, or interested in investing, in the Southern Coalfields, about the availability
108	of, and access to, economic development assistance, including but not limited to, the economic
109	opportunity tax credit provided in section nineteen, article thirteen-q, chapter eleven of this code;
110	the manufacturing investment tax credit provided under article thirteen-s, chapter eleven of this
111	code; and any other applicable tax credit or development assistance.
112	(i) Use of state property and equipment; faculty. — The Development Office or other owner
113	of state property and equipment in the Southern Coalfield counties is authorized to provide for the

- low cost and economical use and sharing of state property and equipment, including computers,
- 115 research labs and other scientific and necessary equipment to assist any business within the
- Southern Coalfields at a nominal or reduced-cost reimbursements to the state for such use.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to create the Southern Coalfield Resiliency and Revitalization program to identify and prioritize existing resources that can be directed to support economic development efforts in the Boone, Logan, McDowell, Mingo, and Wyoming counties; establish a revitalization council to manage these activities; and provide technical assistance support, services, and resources to support community revitalization of the Southern Coalfield counties.
