- A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding a new section,
 designated §17C-13-9, relating to prohibiting pedestrians from standing in roadways or
- 3 right of ways.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 13. STOPPING, STANDING AND PARKING.

§17C-13-9. Prohibition on pedestrians from standing in roadways or right of ways.

- 1 (a) Legislative findings. The Legislature finds that the presence of persons standing in
- 2 the middle of the roadway, on right of ways, or near the roadway creates significant public safety
- 3 hazards for those individuals and motorists.
- 4 (b) *Enactment*. –It is prohibited for anyone to stand in a roadway or on a right of way.
- 5 (c) *Penalty*. Any person violating the provisions of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor
- 6 and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than \$100; upon a second conviction within
- 7 <u>one year thereafter, shall be fined not more than \$200; and upon a third or subsequent conviction,</u>
- 8 shall be fined not more than \$500.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to prohibit pedestrians from standing in roadways or right of ways.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
