1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding a new section,

designated §15-10-8, related to providing for the purchase of service weapons upon

retirement or at the end of service as a law enforcement officer.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 10. COOPERATION BETWEEN LAW-ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES.

§15-10-8. Law-enforcement officers may purchase service weapon upon retirement or at the end of their service.

- 1 (a) Every law-enforcement officer in the state of West Virginia shall be given the
- 2 opportunity to purchase their service weapon at fair market value at the time their service ends,
- 3 upon their retirement, or to have it presented to them at no cost upon retirement if the governing
- 4 body of an agency decides to.
- 5 (b) This shall apply to all law-enforcement agencies in the state, including, but not limited
- 6 <u>to:</u>

- 7 (1) State police
- 8 (2) Sheriffs' offices
- 9 (3) City or municipal officers
- 10 (4) Division of Natural Resources officers
- 11 (4) University or campus police officers
- 12 (5) Any other law enforcement officers in the state of West Virginia.
- 13 (c) The end of an officer's service includes the end of any term of an elected official like a
- 14 County Sheriff. Upon termination of this elected term of service, the officer is permitted to purchase
- their service weapon at fair market value.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide for the purchase of, or presentation of, service firearms to law-enforcement officers upon retirement or the end of their service.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
