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1	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a two new
2	sections, designated §18-2-46 and §18-5-52; and to amend said code by adding thereto a
3	new article, designated §18C-10-1, §18C-10-2, §18C-10-3, §18C-10-4, and §18C-10-5, all
4	relating to creating a statewide initiative to promote teacher preparation programs aimed at
5	underrepresented groups; providing that the West Virginia State Board of Education will
6	create an initiative for this purpose; providing that county boards of education in this state
7	will create initiatives for this purpose; establishing a scholarship fund and providing for
8	funding; providing for definitions; setting forth criteria for the scholarship; and enacting the
9	scholarship.

CHAPTER 18C. STUDENT LOANS; SCHOLARSHIPS AND STATE AID. <u>ARTICLE 10. SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM FOR UNDERREPRESENTED GROUPS AS</u> <u>EDUCATORS.</u>

§18C-10-1. Scholarship fund created; purposes; funding. 1 (a) The purpose of this article is to attract minorities, males, or those persons in rural, 2 isolated, or impoverished areas to become teachers in this state. The Legislature recognizes that 3 a teacher shortage exists, and that incentivizing individuals in these three groups to become 4 educators in this state would increase the workforce, while also providing new opportunities to 5 those who want a career in public education and who may not have previously been aware of the 6 opportunity to become a licensed educator.

7 (b) The higher education governing boards shall propose a joint legislative rule in 8 accordance with the provisions of §29A-3A-1 et seq. of this code, to implement the provisions of 9 this article and shall file the rule with the Legislative Oversight commission on education 10 accountability no later than December 1, 2025. The rule shall provide for the administration of the 11 scholarship for underrepresented groups as educators by the senior administrator in furtherance 12 of the purposes of this article, including, but not limited to, an expression of legislative intent that 13 academic ability be the primary criteria for selecting scholarship recipients, scholarship selection 14 criteria and procedures, renewal, compliance, noncompliance and repayment, deferral, and 15 excusal. The rules also shall provide for appeal procedures under which a recipient may appeal

16	any determination of noncompliance. The rules may provide for satisfaction of the work
17	requirement provided in §18C-10-4(a)(2)(A) of this code through community service relating to
18	public education. In accordance with the rules, the senior administrator shall establish appropriate
19	guidelines for program operation.
20	(c) There is hereby created in the State Treasury a special fund known as the "Scholarship
21	Fund for Underrepresented Groups as Educators" to be administered by the senior administrator
22	for granting scholarships to prospective minorities, males, or those in rural, isolated, or
23	impoverished areas to become educators, in accordance with this article. The Legislature shall
24	appropriate the amount of \$10 million per year from the state general revenue fund to the special
25	treasury fund. Scholarships shall be distributed in the following manner:
26	(1) One third of the scholarships shall go to male applicants;
27	(2) One third of the scholarships shall go to minority applicants; and
28	(3) One third of the scholarships shall go to applicants from isolated, rural, or impoverished
29	areas of this state.
30	(d) Any moneys which may be appropriated by the Legislature, or received by the senior
31	administrator from other sources, for the purposes of this article shall be deposited in the fund. Any
32	moneys remaining in the fund at the close of the fiscal year shall be carried forward for use in the
33	next fiscal year. Any moneys repaid to the senior administrator by reason of default of a
34	scholarship agreement under this article also shall be deposited in the fund. Fund balances shall
35	be invested with the state's consolidated investment fund, and any and all interest earnings on
36	these investments shall be used solely for the purposes for which moneys invested were
37	appropriated or otherwise received.
38	(e) The senior administrator may accept and expend any gift, grant, contribution, bequest,
39	endowment, or other money for the purposes of this article and shall make a reasonable effort to
40	encourage external support for the scholarship program.

<u>§18C-10-2.</u>

Definitions.

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1	When used in this article the following terms have the following meanings, unless the
2	context clearly indicates a different meaning:
3	(a) "Eligible institution of higher education" means a state institution of higher education as
4	defined in §18B-1-2 of this code, and any other institution of higher education in this state, public or
5	private, approved by the senior administrator: Provided, That if any institution listed in this
6	paragraph is not regionally accredited, it shall not be included as an eligible institution.
7	(b) "Underrepresented groups" means students who are a member of a minority class,
8	including, but not limited to, the following:
9	(1) "African American" means a person having origins in any of the original peoples of
10	Africa and who is regarded as such by the community of which this person claims to be a part.
11	(2) "Asian American" means a person having origins in any of the original peoples of the
12	Far East, Southeast Asia, the Indian subcontinent or the Pacific Islands, including, but not limited
13	<u>to, Japan, China, Vietnam, Samoa, Laos, Cambodia, Taiwan, Northern Mariana, the Philippines, a</u>
14	U.S. territory of the Pacific, India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, or Sri Lanka and who is regarded as such
15	by the community of which this person claims to be a part.
16	(3) "Hispanic American" means a person having origins in any of the Spanish-speaking
17	peoples of Mexico, South or Central America, or the Caribbean Islands or other Spanish or
18	Portuguese cultures and who is regarded as such by the community of which this person claims to
19	be a part.
20	(4) "Native American" means a person having origins in any of the original peoples of North
21	America and who is regarded as such by the community of which this person claims to be a part or
22	who is recognized by a tribal organization.
23	(A) Males; or
24	(B) Those students in rural, isolated, or impoverished areas. The definition includes, but is
25	not limited to, individuals who come from any region of the state with a poverty rate greater than
26	the average statewide poverty rate as determined by the U.S. Census Bureau's most recently

27 published data.

	§18C-10-4. Scholarship agreement.
1	(a) Each recipient of the Scholarship for Underrepresented Groups as Educators shall
2	enter into an agreement with the senior administrator under which the recipient shall:
3	(1) Provide the governing boards with evidence of compliance with subsection (a), section
4	five of this article;
5	(2) Agree that within one year following the date the recipient ceases to be a full-time
6	student at an eligible institution in an education program for which the scholarship was awarded he
7	or she will:
8	(A) Begin working full-time in an education related field in this state for a duration of not
9	less than one year for each year the scholarship was received; or
10	(B) Begin repayment of all or part of the Scholarship for Underrepresented Groups as
11	Educators received under this article plus interest and, if applicable, reasonable collection fees, in
12	accordance with §18C-10-5b(b) of this code, except as provided in §18C-10-5(c) and (d) of this
13	<u>code.</u>
14	(b) A scholarship agreement shall disclose fully the terms and conditions of this article
15	under which the scholarship is provided and under which repayment of the scholarship may be
16	required.
	§18C-10-5. Renewal conditions; noncompliance; deferral; excusal.
1	(a) The recipient of a Scholarship for Underrepresented Groups as Educators is eligible for
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2 <u>scholarship renewal if the recipient is:</u>

3	(1) Enrolled as a full-time student in an eligible institution of higher education;
4	(2) Pursuing a course of study leading to a certificate, associate or baccalaureate degree in
5	public education as established by industry-based standards;
6	(3) Maintaining satisfactory progress as determined by the eligible institution of higher
7	education the recipient is attending; and
8	(4) Complying with any other standards established by the governing boards by rule.
9	(b) A recipient who violates a scholarship agreement is required to repay the amount of any
10	scholarship award received, plus interest, and, where applicable, reasonable collection fees, on a
11	schedule and at a rate of interest prescribed in the guidelines of the senior administrator. The
12	legislative rules required in section one of this article shall provide for a method of prorating
13	repayment amounts against any amount of the work requirement that has been fulfilled by the
14	recipient.
15	(c) A recipient is not in violation of the agreement entered into under section three of this
16	article during any period in which the recipient is:
