1 A BILL to amend and reenact §18B-2A-1 and §18B-2A-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as 2 amended, relating to institutional boards of governors; amending legislative findings; 3 increasing number of Board of Governors members at West Virginia University; clarifying 4 that elected faculty, student, and classified or non-classified employees serve as nonvoting 5 advisory members; increasing the number of lay members appointed by the Governor to 6 West Virginia University's Board of Governors; requiring one person of the West Virginia 7 University Board of Governors and of the West Virginia State University Board of 8 Governors to have a background in agriculture, forestry, or the agricultural or silvicultural 9 sciences; clarifying that graduates of West Virginia Institute of Technology of West Virginia 10 University and West Virginia Potomac State College of West Virginia University have a 11 representative serve on West Virginia University's Board of Governors; adding a 12 requirement that the Governor consider the needs of the state of West Virginia and its 13 citizens in making appointments to the institutional board of governors; and making 14 technical changes.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 2A. INSTITUTIONAL BOARDS OF GOVERNORS.
 §18B-2A-1. Findings; composition of boards; terms and qualifications of members; vacancies; eligibility for reappointment.

1 (a) Findings. (

The Legislature finds that the State of West Virginia is served best when the membership
of each governing board includes is informed by the following:

4 (1) The academic expertise and institutional experience of faculty members and a student
5 of the institution governed by the board;

6 (2) The technical or professional expertise and institutional experience of a classified or
7 non-classified employee of the institution governed by the board;

8 (3) An awareness and understanding of the issues facing the institution governed by the9 board; and

(4) The diverse perspectives that arise from a membership that is balanced in terms of
 gender and varied in terms of race and ethnic heritage. and representative of West Virginia and its
 citizens; and

13 (5) For West Virginia's land grant institutions at West Virginia University and West Virginia
 14 State University, focused on serving the needs of West Virginia and its citizens.

15 (b) Boards of governors established. (

16 A board of governors is continued at each of the following institutions: Bluefield State 17 University, Blue Ridge Community and Technical College, BridgeValley Community and Technical 18 College, Concord University, Eastern West Virginia Community and Technical College, Fairmont 19 State University, Glenville State University, Mountwest Community and Technical College, 20 Marshall University, New River Community and Technical College, Pierpont Community and 21 Technical College, Shepherd University, Southern West Virginia Community and Technical 22 College, West Liberty University, West Virginia Northern Community College, the West Virginia 23 School of Osteopathic Medicine, West Virginia State University, West Virginia University and West 24 Virginia University at Parkersburg.

25 (c) Board membership. (

(1) An appointment to fill a vacancy on the board or reappointment of a member who is
eligible to serve an additional term is made in accordance with the provisions of this section.

(2) The Board of Governors for Marshall University consists of 16 persons. The Board of
 Governors for West Virginia University consists of seventeen <u>19</u> persons. The boards of governors
 of the other state institutions of higher education consist of 12 persons.

31 (3) Each board of governors includes the following members:

32 (A) A full-time member of the faculty with the rank of instructor or above duly elected by the
 33 faculty of the respective institution, who shall serve as a nonvoting, advisory member;

34 (B) A member of the student body in good academic standing, enrolled for college credit,
35 and duly elected by the student body of the respective institution, who shall serve as a nonvoting,
36 advisory member; and

37 (C) A member from the institutional classified or non-classified employees duly elected by
 38 the classified or non-classified employees of the respective institution, who shall serve as a
 39 <u>nonvoting, advisory member</u>.

40 (4) For the Board of Governors at Marshall University, 13 lay members appointed by the
41 Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, pursuant to this section;

42 (5) For the Board of Governors at West Virginia University, twelve <u>15</u> lay members
43 appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, pursuant to this
44 section, and additionally:

45 (A) The Chairperson of the Board of Visitors of West Virginia University Institute of
 46 Technology;

47 (B) A <u>a</u> full-time faculty member representing the extension service at the institution or a
48 full-time faculty member representing the health sciences, selected by the faculty senate, who
49 <u>shall serve as a nonvoting, advisory member</u>.

(6) For each board of governors of the other state institutions of higher education, nine lay
members appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, pursuant
to this section.

(A) Of the nine members appointed by the Governor, no more than five may be of the same
political party. Of the 13 members appointed by the Governor to the governing board of Marshall
University, no more than eight may be of the same political party. Of the 42 15 members appointed
by the Governor to the governing board of West Virginia University, no more than seven nine may
be of the same political party.

(B) Of the nine members appointed by the Governor, at least five shall be residents of the
state. Of the 13 members appointed by the Governor to the governing board of Marshall

- University, at least eight shall be residents of the state. Of the twelve <u>15</u> members appointed by the
 Governor to the governing board of West Virginia University, at least seven eight shall be residents
 of the state.
- (C) Of the 15 members appointed by the Governor to the governing board of West Virginia
 University, one shall be specifically designated as a representative of agriculture, forestry, or the
 agricultural or silvicultural sciences and shall have a background in one or more such fields. One
 shall be a graduate of the West Virginia University Institute of Technology. One shall be a graduate
 of Potomac State College of West Virginia University.
 (D) Of the nine members appointed by the Governor to the governing board of West

69 <u>Virginia State University, one shall be specifically designated as a representative of agriculture,</u>

70 forestry, or the agricultural or silvicultural sciences and shall have a background in one or more

71 such fields.

(7) In making lay appointments, the Governor shall consider the institutional mission and
 membership characteristics including the following:

(A) The need for individual skills, knowledge and experience relevant to governing theinstitution;

- (B) The need for awareness and understanding of institutional priorities, opportunities, and
 challenges, including those related to research, teaching and outreach;
- 78 (C) The value of gender, racial and ethnic diversity; and
- (D) The value of achieving balance in gender and diversity in the racial and ethnic
 characteristics of the lay membership of each board; and
- 81 (E) The needs of the State of West Virginia and its citizens.
- 82 (d) Board member terms. (
- 83 (1) The student member serves for a term of one year. Each term begins on July 1.

84 (2) The faculty member serves for a term of two years. Each term begins on July 1. Faculty
85 members are eligible to succeed themselves for three <u>one</u> additional terms <u>term</u>, not to exceed a
86 total of eight four consecutive years.

87 (3) The member representing classified or non-classified employees serves for a term of
88 two years. Each term begins on July 1. Members representing classified or non-classified
89 employees are eligible to succeed themselves for three <u>one</u> additional terms <u>term</u>, not to exceed a
90 total of eight four consecutive years.

91 (4) The appointed lay citizen members serve terms of four years each and are eligible to
92 succeed themselves for no more than one additional term, except that citizen members who are
93 appointed to fill unexpired terms are eligible to succeed themselves for two full terms after
94 completing an unexpired term.

95 (5) A vacancy in an unexpired term of a member shall be filled for the unexpired term within 96 thirty days of the occurrence of the vacancy in the same manner as the original appointment or 97 election. Except in the case of a vacancy, all elections are held and all appointments are made no 98 later than June 30 preceding the commencement of the term. Each board of governors shall elect 99 one of its appointed lay members to be chairperson in June of each year. A member may not serve 100 as chairperson for more than four consecutive years.

101 (6) The appointed members of the boards of governors serve staggered terms of up to four 102 years except that four of the initial appointments to the governing boards of community and 103 technical colleges that became independent July 1, 2008, are for terms of two years and five of the 104 initial appointments are for terms of four years.

105 (e) Board member eligibility, expenses. (

106 (1) A person is ineligible for appointment to membership on a board of governors of a state107 institution of higher education under the following conditions:

(A) For a baccalaureate institution or university, a person is ineligible for appointment who
 is an officer, employee or member of any other board of governors within this state; an employee of

110 any institution of higher education within this state; an officer or member of any political party 111 executive committee; the holder of any other public office or public employment under the 112 government of this state or any of its political subdivisions; an employee of any affiliated research 113 corporation created pursuant to article twelve of this chapter; an employee of any affiliated 114 foundation organized and operated in support of one or more state institutions of higher education; 115 or a member of the council or commission: *Provided*. That if an appointee is an employee or board 116 member of an out-of-state higher education institution, there is no apparent conflict of interest 117 caused by the individual serving in both capacities. This subsection does not prevent the 118 representative from the faculty, classified or non-classified employees, students, or the 119 superintendent of a county board of education from being members of the governing boards.

120 (B) For a community and technical college, a person is ineligible for appointment who is an 121 officer, employee or member of any other board of governors within this state; a member of a 122 board of visitors of any public institution of higher education; an employee of any institution of 123 higher education within this state; an officer or member of any political party executive committee; 124 the holder of any other public office, other than an elected county office, or public employment, 125 other than employment by the county board of education, under the government of this state or any of its political subdivisions; an employee of any affiliated research corporation created 126 127 pursuant to §18B-12-1 et seq. of this code; an employee of any affiliated foundation organized and 128 operated in support of one or more state institutions of higher education; or a member of the 129 council or commission: Provided, That if an appointee is an employee or board member of an out-130 of-state higher education institution, there is no apparent conflict of interest caused by the 131 individual serving in both capacities. This subsection does not prevent the representative from the 132 faculty, classified or non-classified employees, or students from being members of the governing 133 boards.

(2) Before exercising any authority or performing any duties as a member of a governing
board, each member shall qualify as such by taking and subscribing to the oath of office

prescribed by section five, article IV of the Constitution of West Virginia and the certificate thereofshall be filed with the Secretary of State.

(3) A member of a governing board appointed by the Governor may not be removed from
office by the Governor except for official misconduct, incompetence, neglect of duty or gross
immorality and then only in the manner prescribed by law for the removal of the state elective
officers by the Governor.

(4) The members of the board of governors serve without compensation, but are
 reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses actually incurred in the performance of
 official duties under this article upon presentation of an itemized sworn statement of expenses.

(5) The president of the institution shall make available resources of the institution for conducting the business of its board of governors. All expenses incurred by the board of governors and the institution under this section are paid from funds allocated to the institution for that purpose.

§18B-2A-2. Meetings.

(a) The boards of Governors shall hold at least six meetings in every fiscal year, including
 an annual meeting each June for the purpose of electing officers.

Of the sixteen voting members of the boards of Governors of Marshall University and West Virginia University, nine shall constitute a quorum. Of the twelve-voting members of the boards of Governors of the other state institutions of higher education, seven shall constitute a quorum. A majority vote of the quorum shall be necessary to pass upon matters before the institutional board of Governors.

8 (b) The boards of Governors may set aside time as they consider appropriate to afford 9 administrators, faculty, students and classified staff an opportunity to discuss issues affecting 10 these groups.
