A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding a new section,
designated §18A-5-1e, relating to the creation of the Student Bill of Rights.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 5. AUTHORITY; RIGHTS; RESPONSIBILITY.

1	<u>(a) Each s</u>	tudent has the right to a m	eaningful public	education, the mainte	enance of high
2	educational standards, and a system of public education that adequately and equitably seeks to				
3	meet the need of	the individual student.			
4	<u>(b) Each</u>	student has the right to acc	<u>ess to a meaning</u>	gful curriculum and the	e right to voice
5	his or her opinion	s and provide input into the	development of	the public school cur	riculum.
6	<u>(c) Each s</u>	tudent has the right to expr	ess his or her vi	ews in matters that af	fect the quality
7	and content of the	e education that is provided	d, including but r	not limited to, the righ	t to participate
8	individually or three	ough elected representative	es in the develop	ment of the rules and	regulations to
9	which the student	is subject.			
10	<u>(d) Each</u>	student has the right	to adequate	and timely notice	of all rules,
11	regulations, polici	es and sanctions to which	the student	is subject. All	rules and
12	regulations shall l	be available in writing and b	e accessible to a	Ill students. A copy of	the rules of the
13	Board of Education	n shall be maintained in the	e library, guidance	e office, or other appro	opriate place in
14	<u>each public scho</u>	ol in this state. A copy of	the Student Bill	of Rights shall be pro	ovided to each
15	<u>student upon regi</u>	stration at a public school i	<u>n this state.</u>		
16	<u>(e) Each s</u>	tudent has the right to phy	sical safety and	the protection of pers	<u>sonal property,</u>
17	including the right	to safe and sanitary schoo	l buildings and f	acilities.	
18	<u>(f) Each</u>	student has the right to	adequate consi	ultation with teachers	<u>s, counselors,</u>
19	<u>administrators, ar</u>	d other school personnel.			
20	<u>(g) Each s</u>	tudent has the right to free	election of peers	in student organization	ons, as well as
21	the right to seek a	ind hold office.			

22	(h) Each student and the student's parents or authorized representatives have the right to		
23	inspect and review the official records of the school system that relate directly to the individual		
24	student, as provided in this code. A student or the student's parent or guardian shall be notified if		
25	adverse comments are placed in his or her official records.		
26	(i) Students have the right to participate in school activities without being subject to		
27	unlawful discrimination because of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, age, marital status,		
28	personal appearance, sexual orientation, family responsibilities, political affiliation,		
29	handicapping condition, or any other basis of unlawful discrimination under the laws of this state.		
30	(j) Where access to participation in programs or activities is on a competitive basis, each		
31	student has the right to an opportunity to compete on an equal basis.		
32	(k) A student has the right to refuse to participate in school activities which are contrary to		
33	the student's moral, religious, or political beliefs.		
34	(I) Each student shall have the right to respect from teachers, other students,		
35	administrators, and other school personnel, and shall not be subject to ridicule, harassment, or		
36	any punishment that is demeaning or derogatory. No student shall be subject to corporal		
37	punishment.		
38	(m) Principals, assistant principals, school security personnel and other designated		
39	individuals may conduct, or cause to be conducted, such searches of students as are reasonable		
40	to maintain the security, discipline and educational atmosphere of a school building, event or		
41	program, in accordance with the provisions of this code.		
42	(n) Each student shall have the right to use reasonable physical means to defend himself		
43	or herself from assault or physical abuse, and shall not be subject to suspension for using limited,		
44	reasonable, physical means to restrain another person from physically assaulting or harming a		
45	third person.		
46	<u>(o) Each student has the right to present petitions, complaints, or grievances to school</u>		
47	authorities and the right to receive prompt, authoritative replies from school officials regarding the		

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48	disposition of the student's petitions, complaints, or grievances. The procedure for presenting		
49	complaints and grievances is set forth in this code. The alternative procedure for presenting		
50	complaints alleging incidents of harassment and sexual harassment is set forth in this code.		
51	(p) Where a student is entitled to a hearing pursuant to this title, the hearing shall be		
52	impartial, and the student shall be afforded all other rights set forth in the hearing procedures.		
53	(q) Each student shall have the right to exercise his or her constitutional rights of free		
54	speech, assembly, and expression without prior restraint, so long as the exercise of these rights		
55	does not substantially interfere with the rights of others.		
56	(r) The exercise of the constitutional rights of free speech, assembly, and expression by		
57	students shall include, but is not necessarily limited to, the following:		
58	(1) Wearing political buttons, armbands, or other badges of symbolic expression;		
59	(2) Organizing and participating in political and social organizations;		
60	(3) Use of student bulletin boards without prior censorship, but not school bulletin boards		
61	without approval of the use which shall be reasonably provided by the schools;		
62	(4) Preparation and distribution of posters, newspapers, or other printed matter, on or off		
63	school grounds, and the reasonable use of the school public address system subject to standards		
64	adopted by the student government organization in cooperation with school officials; provided, that		
65	such distribution or use shall be limited to reasonable times before, during, and after school hours		
66	in order to prevent undue interference with classroom activities and the rights of others; and		
67	(5) Free expression and defense of views and opinions without having that expression		
68	affect the student's examinations, grades, academic achievement, or participation in extra-		
69	curricular activities.		

NOTE: The purpose of this bill relates to the creation of the Student Bill of Rights.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
