A BILL to amend and reenact §55-7-9 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to violations of statutes; and providing that a person in an automobile accident whose license has been suspended or revoked is at fault for the accident.

ARTICLE 7. ACTIONS FOR INJURIES. §55-7-9. Violation of statutes.

- (a) Any person injured by the violation of any statute may recover from the offender such damages as he <u>or she</u> may sustain by reason of the violation, although a penalty or forfeiture for such violation be thereby imposed, unless the same be expressly mentioned to be in lieu of such damages.
- (b) Any person involved in an automobile accident, when that person has had his or her
 operator's license suspended or revoked, shall be considered in violation of §17B-4-3 of this code,
 and at fault for the accident and responsible to persons for injuries or property damaged.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide that a person in an automobile accident whose license has been suspended or revoked is at fault for the accident and any damages or injuries.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
