1 A BILL to amend and reenact §9-5-12a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to  
 2 increasing the coverage limit; requiring the Bureau for Medical Services to require its  
 3 managed care organizations to provide education to Medicaid enrollees regarding the  
 4 availability of coverage; and requiring reporting.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

**ARTICLE 5. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.**

**§9-5-12a. Medicaid program; dental care.**

1 (a) The following terms are defined:

2 (1) "Cosmetic services" means dental work that improves the appearance of the teeth,  
 3 gums, or bite, including, but not limited to, inlays or onlays, composite bonding, dental veneers,  
 4 teeth whitening, or braces.

5 (2) "Diagnostic and preventative services" means dental work that maintains good oral  
 6 health and includes oral evaluations, routine cleanings, x-rays, fluoride treatment, fillings, and  
 7 extractions.

8 (3) "Restorative services" means dental work that involves tooth replacement, including,  
 9 but not limited to, dentures, dental implants, bridges, crowns, or corrective procedures such as  
 10 root canals.

11 (b) ~~The Department of Health and Human Resources~~ Bureau for Medical Services shall  
 12 extend Medicaid coverage to adults age 21 and over covered by the Medicaid program for  
 13 diagnostic and preventative dental services and restorative dental services, excluding cosmetic  
 14 services. This coverage is limited to \$2,000 each budget year. Recipients must pay for services  
 15 over the \$2,000 yearly limit. No provision in this section shall restrict the department in exercising  
 16 new options provided by, or to be in compliance with, new federal legislation that further expands  
 17 eligibility for dental care for adult recipients.

18 (c) ~~The Department of Health and Human Resources~~ Bureau for Medical Services is  
 19 responsible for the implementation of, and program design for, a dental care system to reduce the

20 continuing harm and continuing impact on the health care system in West Virginia. The dental  
21 health system design shall include oversight, quality assurance measures, case management,  
22 and patient outreach activities. The ~~Department of Health and Human Resources~~ Bureau for  
23 Medical Services shall assume responsibility for claims processing in accordance with established  
24 fee schedules and financial aspects of the program necessary to receive available federal dollars  
25 and to meet federal rules and regulations. The ~~Department of Health and Human Resources~~  
26 Bureau for Medical Services shall seek authority from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid  
27 Services to implement the provisions of this section.

28 (d) On or before December 1, 2027, the Bureau for Medical Services shall file a report with  
29 the Legislative Oversight Commission on Health and Human Resources Accountability and the  
30 Joint Committee on Government and Finance analyzing Medicaid expenditures related solely to  
31 the dental program for the plan year immediately prior to the passage of this legislation and each  
32 plan year until the date of submission of the required report. The report shall include at a minimum  
33 an analysis of the enrollees served, the state share of the Medicaid expenditures, and the federal  
34 share of expenditures.

35 (e) The Bureau for Medical Services shall conduct a survey of dental rates in the United  
36 States and base the rate in West Virginia on the average rate for these services on or before July  
37 1, 2025.

38 (f) The Bureau for Medical Services is responsible for requiring its managed care  
39 organizations to provide education to Medicaid enrollees on a quarterly basis regarding the  
40 availability of the benefits provided in this section beginning July 1, 2025, and ending on July 1,  
41 2029. The Bureau for Medical Services shall file an electronic report, via the Legislative web page,  
42 on July 1, annually, with the Legislative Oversight Commission on Health and Human Resources  
43 Accountability regarding the number of Medicaid enrollees that have accessed the program by  
44 year, the number of providers that have joined the program by year, and the top 10 services  
45 provided by year.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to increase the coverage limit and to require the Bureau for Medical Services to require its Medicaid managed care organizations to provide education to Medicaid enrollees regarding the availability of benefits provided in this section beginning on July 1, 2025, and to require reporting.
