### **Senate Bill 178**

1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding a new section,  
 2 designated 3-1-8a, relating to imposing a limit of three terms on officials elected to public  
 3 office in the state.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

**ARTICLE 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS AND DEFINITIONS.**

**§3-1-18a. Term limits of elected officials.**

1 No person seeking a public office pursuant to §3-1-16, §3-1-17, and §3-1-18 shall serve  
 2 more than three consecutive terms for the same office. This restriction does not apply to partial  
 3 terms to which an official may be appointed.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to limit the number of terms of elected officials to three.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
