## Senate Bill 483

BY SENATORS WOODRUM, OLIVERIO, AND HAMILTON

[Introduced on February 14, 2025; referred

to the Committee on Government Organization]

1 A BILL to amend and reenact §3-8-7 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to 2 increasing the civil penalties for failure to file required campaign finance reports, or filing 3 grossly incomplete or grossly inaccurate campaign finance reports, from \$10 per day to a 4 maximum of \$500 for the first violation, and \$1,000 per report for each subsequent 5 violation; requiring notice to be provided to any political committees violating the filing 6 requirements prior to assessing any civil fines; giving the Secretary of State authority to 7 grant additional time for compliance not to exceed an additional 14 days; authorizing the 8 Secretary of State to negotiate and enter into settlement agreements for payment of the 9 civil penalty, including but not limited to, entering into an installment payment plan; and 10 requiring the Secretary of State to refer any civil penalties that remain outstanding for a 11 period greater than 30 days to a debt collection agency or similar other responsible agent 12 for collection.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

#### **ARTICLE 8. REGULATION AND CONTROL OF ELECTIONS.**

# §3-8-7. Failure to file statement; delinquent or incomplete filing; criminal and civil penalties.

1 (a) Any person, candidate, financial agent, or treasurer of a political committee who fails 2 to file a sworn, itemized statement required by this article within the time limitations specified in 3 this article or who willfully files a grossly incomplete or grossly inaccurate statement is guilty of a 4 misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than \$500 or confined in jail for 5 not more than one year, or both fined and confined. Sixty days after any primary or other election, 6 the Secretary of State or county clerk, or municipal recorder as the case may be, shall give notice 7 of any failure to file a sworn statement or the filing of any grossly incomplete or grossly inaccurate 8 statement by any person, candidate, financial agent, or treasurer of a political party committee 9 and forward copies of any grossly incomplete or grossly inaccurate statement to the prosecuting

attorney of the county where the person, candidate, financial agent, or treasurer resides, islocated, or has its principal place of business.

12 (b)(1) Any person, candidate, financial agent, or treasurer of a political committee who 13 fails to file a sworn, itemized statement as required in this article or who files a grossly incomplete 14 or grossly inaccurate statement shall be assessed a civil penalty by the Secretary of State of \$10 15 a day for each day after the due date the statement is delinguent, grossly incomplete, or grossly 16 inaccurate not to exceed \$500. In the case of a second or any subsequent violation pertaining to 17 the same election cycle, the political committee shall be assessed a civil penalty of \$1,000 per 18 report that is not filed. Sixty days after any primary or other election, the county clerk shall give 19 notice to the Secretary of State of any failure to file a sworn statement or the filing of any grossly 20 incomplete, or grossly inaccurate statement by any person, candidate, financial agent, or 21 treasurer of a political committee and forward copies of such delinquent, incomplete, or inaccurate 22 statements to the Secretary of State.

23 (2) A civil penalty assessed pursuant to this section shall be payable to the State of West
 24 Virginia and is collectable as authorized by law for the collection of debts

25 (1) Prior to assessing a penalty pursuant to this section as a result of the filing of a 26 delinquent report, the Secretary of State shall notify, not later than 14 days after the deadline for 27 the required report, the political committee in writing that a report has not been filed or that a filed 28 report has not been completed, citing the omissions from the report. No penalty shall be assessed pursuant to this section if the report or information required to complete the report is filed within 29 30 seven days of the date of the written notice. Such notice shall be sent to the most recent email address, if any, and mailing address provided by the political committee. 31 32 (A) If the report or information required to complete the report is not filed within the seven-33 day period, the Secretary of State shall assess against the political committee the civil penalty set

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35	(B) The Secretary of State may grant an additional period for compliance, not to exceed
36	14 days, for good cause shown and in response to a request filed within the seven-day period.
37	(2) Prior to assessing a penalty pursuant to this section for the filing or a grossly incomplete
38	or grossly inaccurate report, the Secretary of State shall notify the political committee that a filed
39	report is inaccurate or incomplete, citing the omissions from the report. No penalty shall be
40	assessed if the information required to complete the report is filed within 10 days of the date of
41	the written notice. Such notice shall be sent to the most recent email address, if any, and mailing
42	address provided by the political committee.
43	(A) If the information required to complete the report is not filed within the 10-day period,
44	the Secretary of State shall assess against the political committee the civil penalty set forth in this
45	section.
46	(B) The Secretary of State may grant an additional period for compliance, not to exceed
47	14 days, for good cause shown and in response to a request filed within the 10-day period.

A civil penalty is delinquent if the full amount of the civil penalty has not been timely paid.</li> <li>(A) The Secretary of State may negotiate and enter into settlement agreements for the payment of civil penalties assessed as a result of the filing of a delinquent, grossly incomplete, or inaccurate statement.</li> <li>(B) In lieu of paying the full amount of the civil penalty within 30 days, a political committee may enter into an installment payment plan with the Secretary of State.</li> <li>(C) If the civil penalty remains delinquent for 30 days or longer, or if the political committee fails to adhere to the terms of any installment plan, the Secretary of State shall refer the civil</li> </ul>

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(4) The Secretary of State shall publish online a list of all persons required to file
statements with the Secretary of State who file statements after the deadline in an election cycle.
This list shall be maintained and be publicly available online to include late activity for, at a
minimum, the previous five years up to the current year.

(5) The Secretary of State and county clerk may review and audit any sworn statement
required to be filed pursuant to this article. The State Election Commission shall propose
legislative rules for promulgation, in accordance with §29A-3-1 *et seq.* of this code, to establish
procedures for the assessment of civil penalties as provided in this section.

69 (c)(1) Any candidate, whether nominated by primary election or appointed by executive 70 committee or executive committee chair, who has failed to file any sworn statement as required 71 by this article relating to the immediately preceding primary election for any office by the 84th day 72 before the general election, is disgualified and may not have his or her name appear on the 73 general election ballot. The provisions of §3-8-5b(d) of this code notwithstanding, any sworn 74 statement filed after the deadline required by §3-8-5 of this code must be received in the office 75 indicated by §3-8-5b(a) of this code by the close of business on the 84th day before the general 76 election.

(2) It is unlawful to issue a commission or certificate of election, or to administer the oath
of office, to any person elected to any public office who has failed to file any sworn statement
required by this article and no person may enter upon the duties of his or her office until he or she
has filed such statement, nor may he or she receive any salary or emolument for any period prior
to the filing of the statement.

82 (3) The vacancy on the ballot created by the disqualification in this subsection is subject
83 to §3-5-19 of this code.

84 (d) As used in this section, "grossly" means substantive and material, and specifically
85 includes false or misleading representations and acts of omissions.

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(e) The Secretary of State shall provide by rule protocols for written notice via certified
mail, return receipt requested, to the person, candidate, financial agent, or treasurer of a political
party committee that is not in compliance with the requirements of this section. With respect to a
violation of subsection (c) of this section, the notice shall be provided 60 days after any primary
or other election.
