## Senate Bill 585

By Senators Stuart, Helton, Jeffries, Morris, Oliverio, Phillips, Rose, Rucker, Taylor, Clements, and Takubo [Reported March 6, 2025, from the Committee on the Judiciary; and then to the Committee on Finance]

1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding a new article, 2 designated §18-36-1, §18-36-2, §18-36-3, §18-36-4, §18-36-5, and §18-36-6, relating to 3 school student athlete safety; establishing the Cohen Craddock Student Athlete Safety 4 Act; providing legislative findings; defining terms; creating the Student Athlete Safety 5 Advisory Committee; identifying composition of Student Athlete Safety Advisory 6 Committee; providing duties of Student Athlete Safety Advisory Committee; requiring use 7 of certain safety equipment during high school and middle school football practices; providing warranty and certification related to the usage of certain safety equipment; 8 9 establishing the Cohen Craddock Memorial Grant Program and providing procedures; and 10 creating the Cohen Craddock Memorial Grant Fund.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

#### ARTICLE 36. COHEN CRADDOCK STUDENT ATHLETE SAFETY ACT.

#### §18-36-1. Short Title; findings.

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- (a) This article shall be known, and may be cited as, the "Cohen Craddock Student Athlete
   Safety Act."
- 3 (b) The Legislature hereby finds that:
  - (1) Student athletes face varying risks of injury, including concussions, heat-related illnesses, and cardiac events, which warrant the continual evaluation of safety protocols and equipment standards;
- 7 (2) Repeated head collisions, even with protective helmets, can cause trauma and
  8 concussions that have long-term cognitive and neurological effects, making it essential that
  9 reasonable safety measures are used;
- (3) The evolution and availability of sport-specific safety equipment is constantly evolving
   and should be consistently monitored;
  - (4) Professional sports leagues and collegiate sports teams have increasingly used modern safety equipment to enhance the safety of their athletes;

| 14 | (5) The National Football League recorded the fewest number of concussions during the               |
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| 15 | 2024 season, which the National Football League's Chief Medical Officer attributed, in part, to the |
| 16 | mandatory use of impact reducing soft-shell helmet covers during training camp and regular-         |
| 17 | season practices; and   |
| 18 | (6) The state should consult with medical experts and athletic leaders to help ensure that          |
| 19 | student athletes across West Virginia have knowledge of and access to modern and necessary          |
| 20 | safety equipment for athletic activities.   |
|    | §18-36-2. Definitions.  |
| 1  | As used in this article, the following terms have the meanings ascribed unless the context          |
| 2  | clearly indicates a different meaning:  |
| 3  | "Advisory Committee" means the Student Athlete Safety Advisory Committee;                           |
| 4  | "Department" means the West Virginia Department of Education;                                       |
| 5  | "Fund" means the Cohen Craddock Memorial Grant Fund;  |
| 6  | "Grant Program" means the Cohen Craddock Memorial Grant Program; and                                |
| 7  | "Student Athletes" means all students participating in any interscholastic sport at a high          |
| 8  | school or middle school in West Virginia.   |
|    | §18-36-3. Student Athlete Safety Advisory Committee.  |
| 1  | (a) There is created the Student Athlete Safety Advisory Committee, which shall be                  |
| 2  | administered by the Department of Education.  |
| 3  | (b) The Advisory Committee shall be composed of the following nine members:                         |
| 4  | (1) The Superintendent, or his or her designee who shall chair the Advisory Committee;              |
| 5  | (2) The Cabinet Secretary for the Department of Health, or his or her designee;                     |
| 6  | (3) The Director of the West Virginia University Rockefeller Neuroscience Institute, or his or      |
| 7  | her designee;   |
| 8  | (4) The Dean of the West Virginia University School of Medicine, or his or her designee;            |
| 9  | (5) The Dean of the Marshall University College of Health Professions, or his or her                |

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| 10 | designee; and  |
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| 11 | (6) Four additional individuals appointed by the Governor who have a background in                     |
| 12 | athletic training, sports medicine, or otherwise possess an expertise in athletic safety protocols or  |
| 13 | equipment.   |
| 14 | (c) The Advisory Committee has the following duties:   |
| 15 | (1) Evaluate the safety rules, protocols, and other forms of guidance that are applicable to           |
| 16 | interscholastic athletics, including football, baseball, softball, lacrosse, volleyball, and any other |
| 17 | sport considered appropriate by a majority of the members;   |
| 18 | (2) Evaluate relevant statistics related to injuries incurred by student athletes, including           |
| 19 | those associated with particular athletic activities;  |
| 20 | (3) Evaluate the safety equipment that is minimally required for participation in                      |
| 21 | interscholastic athletics, including football, baseball, softball, lacrosse, volleyball, and any other |
| 22 | sport considered appropriate by a majority of the members;   |
| 23 | (4) Evaluate additional safety equipment items or protective gear that is readily available            |
| 24 | on the market, but not required for participation or regularly provided to student athletes; and       |
| 25 | (5) Make recommendations to the Governor and the Legislative Oversight Commission or                   |
| 26 | Education Accountability on any measures that should be taken to enhance the safety of student         |
| 27 | athletes, including safety equipment that should be used by student athletes or any other changes      |
| 28 | to the rules or governing interscholastic athletics.   |
| 29 | (d) The Advisory Committee shall meet at least once annually but may meet anytime upor                 |
| 30 | being convened by the chair. Members of the Advisory Committee are eligible for reimbursement          |
| 31 | for travel and other expenses incidental to the performance of their duties                            |
|    | §18-36-4. Required use of football helmet covers.  |
| 1  | (a) To the greatest extent practicable as permitted by the availability of grant funding               |
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effective July 1, 2026, student athletes in West Virginia participating in a school organized football

practice shall use an impact reducing soft-shell helmet cover while wearing a football helmet. The

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- 4 <u>impact reducing soft-shell helmet cover shall be attached to a student athlete's football helmet at</u>
- 5 <u>all times when participating in any activity with a likelihood of collision or during any practice</u>
- 6 activity which the student athlete would regularly be expected to use a football helmet: *Provided*,
- 7 That the requirements of this subsection shall become permissive should grant funding for the
- 8 purchase of soft-shell helmet covers not be available.
  - (b) Football helmets that exceed the safety profile of a football helmet with the soft-shell
- 10 <u>helmet cover attached are exempt from the requirements of subsection (a) of this section.</u>
- 11 (c) On an annual basis, the Student Athlete Safety Advisory Committee shall determine
- 12 which football helmets exceed the safety profile of a football helmet with the soft-shell helmet
- 13 cover attached and shall publish, or otherwise make available, a list of those helmets on the
- 14 <u>website of the Department.</u>

#### §18-36-5. Warranty and certification protections.

- 1 (a) The use of an impact reducing soft-shell helmet cover with a football helmet shall not
- 2 void or limit any football helmet manufacturer or dealer's express or implied warranty that may
- 3 otherwise apply to the football helmet: *Provided*, That the impact reducing soft-shell helmet cover
- 4 attaches to the football helmet in a manner that does not modify the components of or otherwise
- 5 <u>damage the football helmet; Provided, however, That one or more helmet manufacturers has</u>
- 6 certified that the impact reducing soft-shell helmet cover is acceptable for use.
- 7 (b) A football helmet manufacturer, dealer, or any other entity that assigns safety
- 8 <u>certifications to football helmets may not revoke a safety certification or guarantee associated with</u>
- 9 a football helmet due to the use of an impact reducing soft-shell helmet cover: *Provided*, That the
- impact reducing soft-shell helmet cover attaches to the football helmet in a manner that does not
- 11 <u>modify the components of or otherwise damage the football helmet; *Provided, however,* That one</u>
- 12 or more helmet manufacturers has certified that the impact reducing soft-shell helmet cover is
- 13 acceptable for use.

#### §18-36-6. Cohen Craddock Memorial Grant Program; fund established.

| 1  | (a) The Cohen Craddock Memorial Grant Program is hereby established. The Grant                        |
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| 2  | Program shall be administered by the Department. The Department shall provide application             |
| 3  | forms and procedures to administer the grant.   |
| 4  | (b) Schools or county boards of education may apply to the Grant Program for funding to               |
| 5  | cover all or some of the costs associated with procuring safety equipment covered by this article or  |
| 6  | recommended by the Advisory Committee.  |
| 7  | (c) The Department shall set the amount of grants based on the funds available, and grants            |
| 8  | shall be issued by the Department on a first-come-first-serve basis.                                  |
| 9  | (d) There shall be created in the State Treasury a special revenue fund designated the                |
| 10 | Cohen Craddock Memorial Grant Fund as follows:  |
| 11 | (1) The Fund shall be administered by the Department, and expenditures from the Fund                  |
| 12 | shall be made for the sole purpose of providing grants authorized by this section;                    |
| 13 | (2) The Fund shall consist of moneys appropriated by the Legislature, moneys received                 |
| 14 | from the federal government, and moneys received from private donations, grants, bequests, and        |
| 15 | all other moneys received from all sources for the purposes stated herein. The Department,            |
| 16 | political subdivisions, and any private entity may engage in fundraising efforts to solicit donations |
| 17 | to the Fund;  |
| 18 | (3) Any monies remaining in the Fund at the end of the fiscal year shall not revert to the            |
| 19 | general revenue but shall remain in the Fund solely for the purposes stated in this article; and      |
| 20 | (4) The moneys accrued in the Fund, any earnings thereon, and any yields from                         |
| 21 | investments by the State Treasurer or West Virginia Investment Management Board are reserved          |
| 22 | solely and exclusively for the purposes set forth in this subsection.                                 |
