A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding a new section,
designated §16-5A-6, relating to the notification of breast density; and providing for
medical guidelines and information.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 5A. CANCER CONTROL.

2	extremely dense breasts based upon the Breast Imaging Reporting and Data System established

5	cancer on a mammogram and also raises the risk of developing breast cancer. Your breast tissue				
6	is not dense. Talk to your healthcare provider about breast density, risks for breast cancer, and				
7	your individual situation." The summary shall also include the patient's specific breast density

18	(c) The repo	ort sent to the individua	l's healthcare pr	ovider must also inclu	ide one of the
19	following breast der	nsity category terms spe	cific to the radiol	ogy findings:	
20	(1) "The bre	asts are almost entirely	fatty";		

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- 21 (2) "There are scattered areas of fibroglandular density";
- 22 (3) "The breasts are heterogeneously dense, which may obscure small masses"; or
- 23 (4) "The breasts are extremely dense, which lowers the sensitivity of mammography."

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide for medical guidelines and information related to breast density.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.

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
