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A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding a new section, designated §30-5-37, relating to pharmacists dispensing Ivermectin; authorizing provision of Ivermectin with a collaborate pharmacy practice agreement; authorizing Ivermectin without a prescription upon federal regulations; clarifying liability and disciplinary action 5 protections for pharmacists and health care providers; authorizing rules; establishing effective dates; and establishing severability.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 5. PHARMACISTS, PHARMACY TECHNICIANS, PHARMACY INTERNS AND PHARMACIES.

- §30-5-37. Provision of Ivermectin with collaborative pharmacy practice agreement; overthe-counter sale of Ivermectin; protections for pharmacists; rulemaking; effective date; severability.
- 1 (a) Provision of Ivermectin with collaborate pharmacy practice agreement. —
- 2 A pharmacist, in good faith, may provide Ivermectin to a patient pursuant to a valid 3 collaborative pharmacy practice agreement, in accordance with §30-5-19, containing a non-4 patient-specific prescriptive order and standardized procedures developed and executed by one 5 or more authorized prescribers.
- 6 (b) Authorization to dispense Ivermectin without a prescription. —
 - (1) Upon the federal Food and Drug Administration approving Ivermectin for over-thecounter use, notwithstanding any other provision of this code, a licensed pharmacist may dispense Ivermectin for human use to a patient without requiring a prescription from a licensed health care provider;
- 11 (2) The pharmacist shall provide the patient with the FDA-approved patient information 12 sheet on Ivermectin at the time of sale; and
 - (3) No consultation with a pharmacist or other health care provider is required for the sale

14	or purchase of Ivermectin.
15	(c) Pharmacist and health care provider protections. —
16	(1) A pharmacist who dispenses Ivermectin in accordance with this section shall not be
17	liable for damages in any civil action, criminal prosecution, or professional disciplinary proceeding
18	for dispensing Ivermectin under this section, provided that the pharmacist acts in good faith and in
19	accordance with applicable laws and professional standards; and
20	(2) A health care provider shall not be subject to disciplinary action by any licensing board
21	or other state regulatory agency for prescribing or recommending the use of Ivermectin for any
22	condition within their scope of practice.
23	(d) Rulemaking. —
24	The West Virginia Board of Pharmacy may establish rules to implement this section in
25	accordance with the provisions of §29A-3-1 et seq. of this code.
26	(e) Effective date. —
27	(1) The provisions of this section, except §30-5-37(b), shall be effective 90 days from
28	passage.
29	(2) §30-5-37(b) shall be effective immediately upon the federal Food and Drug
30	Administration approving Ivermectin for over-the-counter use.
31	(f) Severability. —
32	If any provision of this section or its application to any person or circumstance is found to
33	be invalid, the remainder of this section and its application to other persons and circumstances
34	shall not be affected.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to enable pharmacists to dispense Ivermectin for human use pursuant to a collaborative pharmacy practice agreement and without a prescription, once the FDA approves of it for over-the-counter use.
