1	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding a new article,
2	designated §11-13NN-1, relating to taxes: providing a title; providing findings and purpose;
3	providing definitions; creating a tax credit; establishing requirements for the credit; and
4	tying dollar figures to inflation.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

# ARTICLE 13NN. SMALL BUSINESS APPRECIATION AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

### <u>АСТ.</u>

#### §11-13NN-1. Small business tax credit.

(a) This article shall be known as the West Virginia Small Business Appreciation and
 Acknowledgement Act.

3 (b) The Legislature finds that the encouragement of economic growth and development in
4 this state is in the public interest and promotes the general welfare of the people of this state. In
5 order to encourage capital investment in business and industry in this state and thereby increase
6 economic development, there is hereby provided certain tax credits.

7 (c) For purposes of this article, the term "small business" means a business which has

8 <u>annual gross receipts of less than \$2 million, including the gross receipts of any affiliates in its</u>

9 <u>controlled group.</u>

10 (d) Amount of credit allowed pursuant to this article is a \$2,000 credit to the eligible small

- 11 business taxpayer as compensation for the time small business owners must spend to comply with
- 12 state law, including collecting taxes on behalf of the state from employees, and complying with
- 13 required state regulations.
- 14 (e) If a small business earns less than \$50,000 a year, the credit shall be reduced to \$500
- 15 for that fiscal year.
- 16 (f) All dollar figures pursuant to this article are directly tied to the current rate of inflation.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide small business owners a tax credit for the time

expended complying with state laws and regulations.
