| 1 | A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding a new section,     |
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| 2 | designated §49-2-120a, relating to payment rates for child care services; requiring the   |
| 3 | Bureau for Family Assistance to annually adjust the base rate for each type of care based |
| 4 | upon the Consumer Price Index; requiring the Bureau for Family Assistance to study the    |
| 5 | implementation of performance-based contracting's outcome on quality; and requiring       |
| 6 | reporting.  |

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:\_

#### ARTICLE 2. STATE RESPONSIBILITIES FOR CHILDREN.

# §49-2-120a. Payment Rates for childcare services; study of performance-based contracting; reporting.

1 (a) The federal Child Care & Development Fund which provides the primary funding for the

2 <u>state's childcare program, requires the state to develop a plan for the operation of services.</u>

3 (b) The state plan shall address how federal funds will be utilized to address the federal

- goals of childcare to approve affordability, availability of childcare programs, and quality of
  childcare programs.
- 6 (c) Rates for payment of childcare services include a base rate for each type of care as well
  7 as incentive rates.
- 8 (d) Beginning September 1, 2025, and September 1<sup>st</sup> annually thereafter, the Bureau of
- 9 Family Assistance shall increase the base rate for each type of care based upon the Consumer
- 10 Price Index for all Urban Consumers.
- 11 (e) Beginning August 1, 2025, the Bureau for Family Assistance shall study the
- 12 implementation of a performance-based contracting to enhance the quality of childcare delivered
- 13 as required by the state plan. The study shall include but not be limited to a consideration of how
- 14 incentive payments to providers may work to improve quality outcomes such as kindergarten
- 15 readiness in children attending childcare centers.
- 16 (f) The Bureau for Family Assistance shall prepare a report of its findings to be made to the

#### 17 Legislative Oversight Commission on Health and Human Resources Accountability on or before

#### 18 <u>December 15, 2025.</u>

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require the Bureau for Family Assistance to increase the base rate paid to childcare providers and to study a performance-based model of incentive payments to increase quality and to provide reporting.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
